

## **TDR Qualification Procedures**

## **TDR Sending Site Application Process**

## **TDR** Qualification Phase (application for a Non-Binding Estimate of TDRs on Sending Property)

- 1. A TDR pre-application meeting is the first step in Qualifying TDRs.
- 2. The next step in the process to Qualify TDRs requires an application process and submittal of the following items:
  - i. Letter of Intent
  - ii. Sending Site Criteria Form
  - iii. TDR Pre-Application Worksheet (County Zoning determination)
  - iv. Application Form for TDR Qualification
  - v. Warranty Deed
  - vi. Legal Description of the Property
  - vii. Site Plan/Plat
  - viii. Sending Site Assessment
- **3.** County staff makes a Non-Binding TDR Estimate based on information provided by applicant.
- 4. Non-Binding Estimate of Qualfied TDRs on Sending property.
  - i. Non-Binding Estimate is based on the following:
    - i. Property Acreage
    - ii. Number of existing dwelling units
    - iii. Zoning district
    - iv. Identification of any easements/encumbrances on the property owner
  - **ii.** Non-Binding Estimate identifies conditions that would be required for TDR Certification, including:
    - 1. Completion of a TDR Agreement
    - 2. Completion of a TDR Sending Area Plat



## **TDR Certification Procedures**

**TDR Certification Phase** The TDR Certification Phase consists of all required steps to severe Transferable Development Rights from the Sending Site.

- 1. Letter of Intent to Certify TDRs
- 2. TDR Certification Pre-application meeting with Planning and Building and Development Services
  - a. TDR Agreement
  - **b.** TDR Sending Area Plat
- 3. TDR Certification Application Form
- 4. BCC approval of TDR Agreement
- 5. TDR Agreement and TDR Sending Area Plat Recordation
- 6. TDR Certificates Issued
