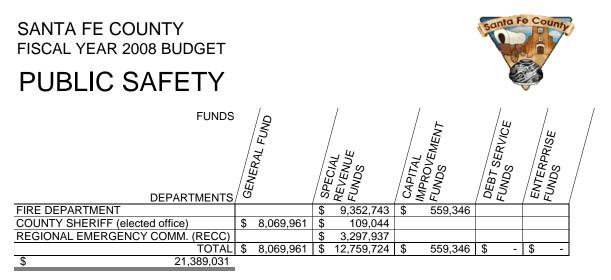

 Increase the number of Sheriff's Deputies from 68 to 90 by 2010 with salaries competitive with the City of Santa Fe.

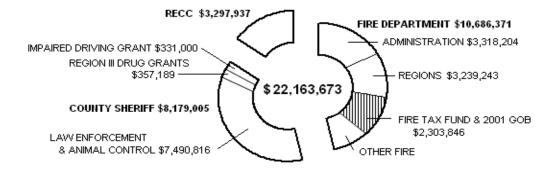
#### **REGIONAL EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER (RECC)**
