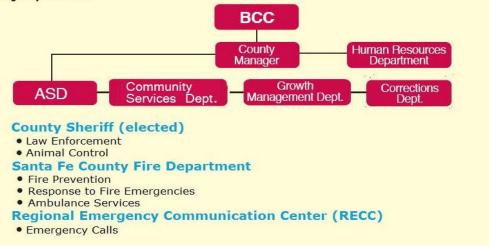

# Accomplishments:

#### SANTA FE COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT

- Responded to over 4,500 emergency calls throughout the County and neighboring counties.
- Opened and staffed the Agua Fria fire station
- Completed 100 development plan reviews, 155 field inspections of automatic sprinkler systems, and 150 site inspections for all new commercial businesses in the County.
- Completed acceptance tests on 171 new hydrant installations.
- Estgablished Fire Department Training Division.
- Graduated 19 firefighter/EMTs in 2007 Cadet Academy.
- Trained all regional staff to Firefightr II level.

#### COUNTY SHERIFF

- Completed construction of and staffed Computer Forensic Lab.
- Increased deputies on the streets through grants, additional full-time employees, and fully staffed positions.
- Established capability of filing reports from vehicle computers, providing increased service to the public.
- Completed transition from part-time non-certified deputies to full-time certified deputies in the Court Security Unit.

**REGIONAL EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER (RECC)** 

- Implemented Phase II of enhanced E911 caller identification. Receiving VOIP calls.
- Increased hourly wage to maintain 80% of staffing at all times.

### LONG TERM GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT

- 1. Respond to all emergency calls in 15 minutes or less 80% of the time
- 2. Respond to all life-threatening calls in 10 minutes or less 90% of the time
- 3. Respond with ALS/Paramedic to all calls in less than 20 minutes 90% of the time
- 4. Integrate a total of 48 new firefighters into the current system
- 5. Get paramedic staff up to double peramedic crews and ALS pumpers
- 6. Put paid staff in La Tierra station
- 7. Add Quints and Quint crews to Edgewood, Pojoaque and La Cienega. ALS Quints/Pumpers in all regions
- 8. Expand inspection program to target additional life safety hazards
- 9. Increase the number of residential and commercial sprinkler installations throughout the County
- 10. Build a professional arson investigation / fire cause and origin capability
- 11. Begin operations of new training facility to include all aspects of fire and EMS

#### **COUNTY SHERIFF**

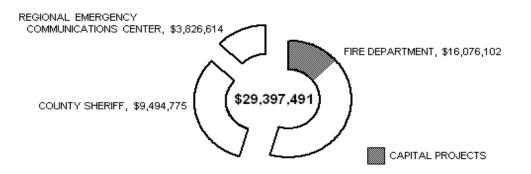
- 1. Continue to remain competitive with the City of Santa Fe in Deputy and Animal Control salaries
- 2. Increase the number of Sheriff's Deputies to 90 by 2010.
- 3. Be staffed, trained and equipped to handle the new District Court House slated to open in 2010
- 4. Use computer mapping and crime analysis to reduce and prevent crime in Santa Fe County

#### **REGIONAL EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER (RECC)**

- 1. Serve as the initial point of response to 911 calls from anyone in the Santa Fe region
- 2. Facilitate interagency communication between City and County fire and police agencies responding to an emergency situation.
