

SANTA FE COUNTY FISCAL YEAR 2009 BUDGET ELECTED OFFICES Accomplishments:



COUNTY CLERK

- Recording Increased revenues by implementing a copier auditron system that allows accurate billing to customers.
- Recording Utilized a document imaging system under NMSRA guidelines to improve efficiency and customer service.
- Elections 100% compliance with HAVA requirements.
- Elections ES&S Voter System in place and Santa Fe County is on line.
- Elections Voter Outreach Program utilizing printed materials and advertising.

ASSESSOR

- Assessed 2223 new lots valued at \$1.35 billion. Processed over 4,000 deeds and transfer affidavits for ownership changes and address changes.
- Completed a major renovation of the front part of the office to address public and employee safety, and constructed a conference room.
- Digitized over 87,000 property record cards and inventoried, corrected and entered over 87,000 sets of attributes into a computer program to be downloaded into the new CAMA system.

TREASURER

- Invested County funds in short-term CDs that do not exceed 48 months, and yield 75 to 150 basis points above the State Treasurer's Investment Pool.
- Worked with Assessor and Rural Addressing to correct 3,700 taxpayer addresses to obtain an
 updated tax roll from the Assessor to reduce return mail.
- Sent out 8,000 semi-annual delinguent tax notices to taxpaper to improve collection rates.
- Received revenue directly and from County departments and deposited all funds within 24 hours of receipt.

LONG TERM GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

COUNTY CLERK

- 1. Continue scanning projects to transfer microfilm of records to CDs.
- 2. Finish Plat CD import by downloading to system.
- 3. Upgrade housing and storage for historically significant and irreplaceable records and documents located in the vault.
- 4. Work on space requirements and utilization future growth of the Clerk's Office.

COUNTY TREASURER

- 1. Develop on-going investment policies and procedures that generate higher yields.
- 2. Reduce errors in regard to mis-crediting payments to the wrong taxpayer accounts, and eliminate duplicate payments.
- 3. Work jointly with the Assessor's Office to educate and inform the public to provide correct ownership and address information.
- Reduce returned mail due to incorrect addresses and inadequate conversion of rural routes to E-911 addresses.

COUNTY ASSESSOR

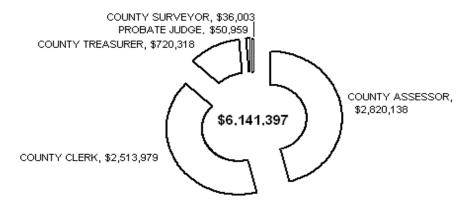
- 1. Generate the 2009 Notices of Value using the Manitron (Computer Assisted Mass Appraisal = CAMA) system without any major problems.
- 2. Continue to improve the relationship and communication between County, City, State and Tribal governments.

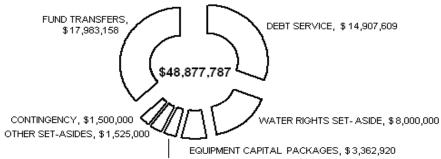
