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## **A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING CERTAIN ROADS FOR COUNTY MAINTENANCE**

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**Whereas**, Santa Fe County encompasses a geographical area of approximately 2,000 square miles; and

**Whereas**, the County is primarily rural with small areas of concentrated development; and

**Whereas**, a comprehensive road system is a necessary and vital link between communities; and

**Whereas**, there are an estimated 1,500 total miles of roads within the County; and

**Whereas**, of the total miles, approximately 600 miles are recognized as County Roads and maintained by the County; and

**Whereas**, the County's goal is to provide the best services possible to its residents within the available resources; and

**Whereas**, the citizens of Santa Fe County continuously request the County to provide maintenance on Non-County roads; and

**Whereas**, the County has the authority and capability to accept roads for maintenance; and

**Whereas**, Camino de Paz, Paseo de Galisteo, and County Road 67A extension are located within Santa Fe County; and

**Whereas**, the residents have asked the County to accept and provide maintenance on these roads; and

**Whereas**, the County has provided periodic maintenance on these roads in the past; and

**Whereas**, the County has conducted an inspection on these roads; and

**Whereas**, the Board of County Commissioners believes it to be in the best interest of the residents to accept the roads; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Santa Fe County Board of County Commissioners accepts the following described roads for County maintenance.

*Camino de Paz*, a dirt 18 feet driving surface road, from the intersection of State Road 76 to the dead end, a distance of 0.5 miles. The acceptance is conditional upon removal of the gate at 0.4 miles.

*Paseo de Galisteo*, a dirt 25 feet driving surface road, from the intersection of County Road 69 to the dead end, a distance of 0.5 miles.

*County Road 67A extension*, a dirt 18 feet driving surface road, from the end of the existing County Road 67A to the Forest Service Boundary, a distance of 0.7 miles. The current length of County Road 67A is 1.4 miles, from the intersection with County Road 67 to the cattle guard. The new length of County Road 67A will be 2.1 miles. The residents have verbally agreed and will be preparing a dedication plat, dedicating a fifty-foot easement to the County. The acceptance is conditional upon completion of the dedication plat.

*Santa Fe County does not accept any maintenance responsibility for residential driveways or drainage structures on driveways. It is advisable that residents repair damaged culverts and reinstall culverts to the proper flow line elevation. In the event that improper installation or lack of maintenance of drainage structures causes damage to the County maintained road, the County reserves the right to collect damages for repair against the responsible party.*
