A PROCLAMATION CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 9, 2002, CONCERNING WHETHER TO IMPOSE A ¼ OF ONE PERCENT COUNTY CAPITAL OUTLAY GROSS RECEIPTS TAX

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County, New Mexico (the "Commission"), has determined on its own initiative to submit to a special election the question of whether to impose a ¼ of one percent County capital outlay gross receipts tax, in accordance with NMSA §7-20E-21 (2001), for the purposes hereinafter specified without the prior filing of a petition by qualified electors; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Commission that it is necessary and in the best interest of the residents of Santa Fe County, New Mexico (the "County") that there be submitted to a vote of the registered qualified electors of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION AS FOLLOWS:

The Commission, on its own initiative, does hereby state:

- A. That on the 9th day of April 2002, an election will be held in the County of Santa Fe.
- B. That persons shall be voting on whether to impose a 1/4 of one percent county capital outlay gross receipts tax.
- C. That the question to be voted upon is:

SUSTAINABLE WATER SUPPLY, SAFE ROADS AND OPEN SPACE PROTECTION MEASURE

Shall the County of Santa Fe, New Mexico, for the purposes of creating a sustainable water supply for the region and improving and protecting water quality of rivers, streams and aquifers, improving the safety of roads, streets and bridges, and preserving and protecting historic areas, wildlife habitat and open spaces, enact an ordinance imposing on all persons engaging in business in the County of Santa Fe a ¼ of one percent County capital outlay gross receipts tax. The proceeds will be used as follows: (1) 75% (3/16 of one percent) for the purposes of (a) enhancing and preserving the region's water resources, aquifers and watersheds through acquisition, construction and improvement of water supply and wastewater systems and facilities; (b) improving public safety through construction, reconstruction and improvement of roads, streets and bridges, and (c) preserving and enhancing rivers, arroyos, historical areas and wildlife habitat through the acquisition of land for open space, public parks or public recreational facilities and through the design, acquisition, construction, improvement and equipping of parks and recreational facilities; and (2) the remaining 25% (1/16 of one percent) for public improvements as allowed by law, including all of the preceding purposes. All expenditures are subject to an annual independent audit and public review.



NMSA 1978 Comp., shall be entitled to vote in said election by absentee ballot beginning on the 28th day of February 2002 from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm., ending on the 6th day of April, 2002, in the office of the County Clerk.
- F. That the polling places on April 9, 2002 will be open from 7:00 am. – 7:00 pm.
- G. That the registration for the qualified electors will close March 12, 2002 at 5:00 pm., twenty-eight (28) days prior to the election.
