## Resolution No. 2010- 114

**A Resolution Supporting New Mexico Senate Joint Resolution 5, New Mexico Constitutional Amendment, Proposing To Amend Article 10, Section 2 Of The Constitution Of New Mexico To Allow Elected County Officers To Serve Up To Three Consecutive Four-Year Terms, Instead of The Current Limit Of Two Consecutive Terms**

**Whereas, New Mexico Senate Joint Resolution 5 is an act relating to county officers term limits; and**

**Whereas, currently New Mexico Constitution Article 10, Section 2 allows elected county officers to serve two consecutive four-year terms; and**

**Whereas, Senate Joint Resolution 5 proposes to amend Article 10, Section 2 of the Constitution of New Mexico to allow elected county officers to serve up to three consecutive four-year terms, instead of the current limit of two consecutive terms; and**

**Whereas, on November 2, 2010, New Mexico voters will be asked to vote for or against the amendment to New Mexico Constitution Article 10, Section 2;**

**Now Therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County:**

**That Santa Fe County support New Mexico Senate Joint Resolution 5, amending New Mexico Constitution Article 10, Section 2, which would result in more consistent, efficient and effective administration of county resources.**




