Ribbon Cutting Ceremony Max Coll Corridor Community Center

May 3, 2016 was the inauguration of the Max Coll Corridor Community Center located between the Ken and Patty Adam Senior Center and the Vista Grande Library.

The Max Coll Corridor Community Center completes a larger vision of providing quality activity space, both indoor and out, to serve the needs of the Highway 285 Corridor. The name of the facility reflects the appreciation in Santa Fe County for the career-long dedication that late the State Representative, Max Coll devoted to this community. The Community Center will provide activity area for meetings, events and family gatherings and additional space for yoga, dance and exercise classes put on by the Senior Center.

The Community Center also houses a Santa Fe County Satellite Office for easy access to transfer station user permits, County job postings and other County related business. The Community Center functions as a standalone facility so that the Center can be used nights and weekends without impacting the Senior Center.

Santa Fe County will be preparing the 2018-2022 Infrastructure and Capital Improvements Plan (ICIP) to submit to the NM Department of Finance and Administration, Local Government Division (DFA/LGD). The ICIP serves as a planning tool and a funding request mechanism to address capital project needs. The plan may include facilities, roads, utilities, parks, equipment and other capital projects.

Pinon Hills Subdivision Road Improvements Started 6/1

A contractor for the Santa Fe County Public Works Department began the preparation for new chip seal road surfaces in the Pinon Hills Subdivision on the following roads:

- Sloman Lane
- East and West Calle Estevan
- East and West Calle Francisca
- West Calle Carla
- Calle Suzanna

Weather permitting, this work is scheduled through late July 2016. Work will begin promptly at 7 a.m. and end by 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Traffic control will be in place during the course of this work allowing for full access to all residential properties along these routes.

Romero Park Improvements Underway

Santa Fe County started construction on the Romero Park (formerly known as Agua Fria Park), located off County Rd 62 in the historic Village of Agua Fria in April 2015.

Romero Park is an existing community park that is being updated. Phase I Park Improvements include a new community lawn, playground for 5-12 year old children, shade structure and family picnic area, new access drive and parking, connector trails and walkways, signage, landscaping, and irrigation. New park elements are organized around select existing park facilities to remain. Existing amenities to remain include a basketball court, baseball field, dog park, playground for children ages 3-5 year old, and a restroom/concession building.
