BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSION SUMMARY



**I-25 / NM 14 (Cerrillos Road)
Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) Night Closures
Re-Scheduled For August 3**

The New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) will continue construction on the I-25/NM14 (Cerrillos Road) Diverging Diamond Interchange located south of Santa Fe. The contractor has removed the two ramps to southbound NM 14 that were closed last month and will now begin removing portions of the I-25 bridges over Cerrillos Road. NMDOT thanks you for your patience during this improvement project.

The NM 14 (Cerrillos Road) night closures have been **Re-scheduled** from July 27 through August 2 to Monday, August 3 through Friday, August 7 from 9:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. each night.

During each nightly closure, the NM 14(Cerrillos Road) northbound and southbound lanes will be CLOSED at 9:00 p.m. from Beckner Road to Rancho Viejo. Southbound NM 14 (Cerrillos Road) traffic will be detoured to I-25 West Frontage Road to NM 599 to access Southbound NM 14 (Cerrillos Road). Northbound NM 14 (Cerrillos Road) traffic will be detoured to NM 599 to I-25 West Frontage Road to access Northbound NM 14 (Cerrillos Road). NM 14 (Cerrillos Road) will be RE-OPENED at 6:00 a.m. each morning.

The NM 14(Cerrillos Road) northbound on-ramp to northbound I-25 will be CLOSED. Traffic will be detoured to the NM 599 interchange to access I-25 northbound. The I-25 on-ramp will be RE-OPENED at 6:00 a.m. each morning

The NM 14 southbound on-ramp to I-25 southbound and the I-25 (Exit 278) off-ramps to NM 14 (Cerrillos Road) will remain OPEN.

BCC Summary for July 14, 2015

Below is a summary of the actions taken by the Santa Fe Board of County Commissioners (BCC). All five Commissioners were present.

The meeting minutes from the June 9, 2015 BCC Meeting were passed by unanimous vote 5-0.

HONORING OUR VETERANS AND SERVICE MEN AND WOMEN

- Jose (Joe) Eufrazio Thomas - Joe joined the United States Army in 1968. During his time in the military he served in the Viet Nam war where he served approximately 18 months. He returned to New Mexico after his service with the Army and joined the Santa Fe Police Department as an officer from which he retired in 1993, after 22 years. After retiring from the Santa Fe Police Department he worked for the Santa Fe Public Schools for 18 years.
- Robert Griego - Robert joined the military and served on Active Duty in the US Navy from January 1989 to January 1993 as an Operations Specialist. He served in Operation Desert Shield in the Persian Gulf and received the National Defense Service Medal; the Southwest Asia Service Medal with Bronze Star; and a Sea Service Ribbon. Robert received an Honorable Discharge from the US Navy Reserve in January 1997. Robert has been an employee of Santa Fe County since 2000.

LAND USE CASES

- CDRC CASE # APP 13-5382 Elevation Multi-Family Community Appeal. Vedula Residential Operating, LLC, Applicant, JenkinsGavin, Agents, received conditional approval from the County Development Review Committee (CDRC) for Preliminary and Final Development Plan for a multi-family residential community consisting of 200 residential units on 22 ± acres. The applicant is aggrieved with a Condition of Approval, imposed by the CDRC, on the approval of the Preliminary and Final Development Plan. The condition imposed by the CDRC states “No construction of buildings may begin until actual construction of the southeast connector begins”. The applicant requests an appeal to the Board of County Commissioners of the condition imposed by the CDRC on the Preliminary and Final Development Plan. Approved by unanimous vote, 5-0 with conditions. (District 5)
- CDRC CASE # V/DP 13-5381 Elevation Multi-Family Community Variance. Vedula Residential Operating, LLC, Applicant, JenkinsGavin, Agents, received conditional approval from the County Development Review Committee (CDRC) for Preliminary and Final Development Plan for a multi-family residential community consisting of 200 residential units on 22 ± acres. The applicant requests BCC approval of a variance of Ordinance No. 2000-12, Section 6.E.3.c to allow a no-outlet roadway to exceed 300 feet and a variance of Santa Fe County Ordinance 1996-10, the Santa Fe County Land

Development Code, Article V, Section 8.1.4, which states that dead end roads may not serve more than thirty (30) dwelling units. The two variances were the subject of a recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners by the CDRC. Denied by unanimous vote, 5-0. (District 5)
