Need for more balanced and efficient development patterns


What is the Code?


 The SLDC will implement the goals, policies, and strategies of the adopted Sustainable Growth Management Plan (SGMP) approved November 2010.

 The Sustainable Land Development Code (SLDC) will replace the existing 1996 Land Development Code.

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Three Tiers of Code Process:





Phase I:

- Initial Administrative Sections
 - Chapters 1-4

• Public Input

 Public Review and Comments Phase II:

- Remaining Administrative and Financial Sections
- Released as Chapters are drafted

• Public Input

• As released take public review and comments

Phase III:

- Design Standards and Zoning
 - TRT to identify additional issues

• Public Input

- Water/Zoning and additional issues
- Code Drafting after public input.
 - Release Chapters
- Public Input
 - Public Review and Comments
