15. Public Meeting Disclosures

A. Santa Fe County makes every practical effort to assure that auxiliary aids or services are available for meetings and programs. B. * During the course of an open meeting, the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) may go into Executive Session at any time to discuss any item on the agenda that falls within the enumerated exceptions to the open meetings requirement of the Open Meetings Act, upon a motion stating the authority and reason for closure (with reasonable specificity) and approval by a majority vote of a BCC quorum. NMSA 1978, §10-15-1(I). While the BCC has a practice of listing on its agendas for its open meetings specific items to be discussed during for Executive Session, the Open Meeting Act does not require executive sessions be listed on the agenda at all or that executive sessions be listed on the agenda multiple times for multiple executive sessions to occur (so long as the subject to be discussed in executive session is on the agenda). If a closed meeting is called when the BCC is not in an open meeting, the BCC will provide public notice stating the specific provision of the law authorizing the closed meeting and stating with reasonable specificity the subject to be discussed.
