SUMMARY

This Proclamation proclaims May 7-13, 2017 National Correctional Officers and Employees Week.

BACKGROUND

National Correctional Officers and Employees Week, held during the first full week in May, is an annual nationwide commemoration of correctional officers and personnel who work in jails, prisons and community corrections throughout the country.

Corrections officers, employees and volunteers in Santa Fe County serve the county's mission of safe and secure communities every day, by supervising offenders and providing services for their return as law-abiding citizens.

Across Santa Fe County, and across the country, corrections workers, in all fields, risk their lives daily to ensure the protections that many take for granted.

WHEREAS, National Correctional Officers and Employees Week, held during the first full week in May, is an annual nationwide commemoration of correctional officers and personnel who work in jails, prisons and community corrections throughout the country; and

WHEREAS, President Ronald Reagan issued Proclamation 5187 in 1984, recognizing "National Correctional Officers" week for the first time that year, noting the ever-expanding multidisciplinary responsibilities of correctional officers; and

WHEREAS, In 1996, Congress changed the name to "National Correctional Officers and Employees Week," the week's current name, in order to recognize the crucial work done by civilian corrections employees and volunteers; and

WHEREAS, Corrections officers, employees and volunteers in Santa Fe County serve the county's mission of safe and secure communities every day, by supervising offenders and providing services for their return as law-abiding citizens; and

WHEREAS, Officers at the Santa Fe County Adult Detention Center and Youth Development Program are not "guards"; they are a diverse, dedicated and professional staff, called upon to simultaneously fill custodial, supervisory and counseling roles; and

WHEREAS, Across Santa Fe County, and across the country, corrections workers, in all fields, risk their lives daily to ensure the protections that many take for granted.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED by the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County that the week of May 7-12th, 2017, is:
