

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

### **SUMMARY:**

This resolution delegates signatory authority to the County Manager to include the County as coapplicant on Office of the State Engineer (OSE) water transfer application when a developer transfers water rights to a County water right permit as may be required as a condition of County water utility service.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Pursuant to the County's Line Extension and Water Service Policy ("Water Service Policy"), adopted by Resolution No. 2006-57, the County requires developers, at their own expense, to acquire and transfer to the County water rights as may be required by the County Utility to provide water service to their developments. The process of transferring water rights through the OSE can be prolonged, resulting in uncertainty in the development schedule.

### DISCUSSION:

Customarily, the delegation of authority to the County Manager to sign as co-applicant occurs once the Board of County Commission (BCC) approves water service agreements or similar transfer agreements with the developers. Staff has prepared this proposed resolution as a result of a request from the developers' representatives, who expressed interest in being able to seek water right transfers in advance of BCC-approved "transfer" agreements, thus potentially reducing delays in the development schedule from the water right transfer.

### **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Approve subject resolution.

### THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SANTA FE COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 2016 -

A RESOLUTION DELEGATING AUTHORITY TO THE COUNTY MANAGER TO SIGN APPLICATIONS TO TRANSFER WATER RIGHTS TO THE COUNTY IN CASES WHERE THE DEVELOPER REQUESTS COUNTY WATER UTILITY SERVICE AND THE OFFICE OF THE STATE ENGINEER REQUESTS THE DEVELOPER AND THE COUNTY TO BE CO-APPLICANTS OR IT IS OTHERWISE IN THE COUNTY'S INTEREST TO BE A CO-APPLICANT

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Santa Fe County ("County") Line Extension and Water Service Policy ("Water Service Policy"), adopted by Resolution No. 2006-57, the County requires developers at their own expense to acquire and transfer to the County such water rights as may be required by the County Utility to provide new water service to their developments; and

WHEREAS, the point of diversion of the water rights acquired by developers must typically be changed to a County point of diversion, such as the Buckman Direct Diversion; and

WHEREAS, the purpose and place of use of the water rights must also typically be changed to County Utility purposes and the Utility service area, respectively; and

WHEREAS, changes to a water right's point of diversion, purpose and place of use (collectively referred to as a "water rights transfer") may only be accomplished by filing a transfer permit application with the Office of the State Engineer ("OSE"); and

WHEREAS, OSE's water rights transfer process can be contentious and involve costly and time-consuming adversarial proceedings before the OSE and again before a state district court, and court's final decision may then be appealed as of right to the New Mexico Court of Appeals; and

WHEREAS, after conclusion of the OSE transfer process, including any appeals, the County requires the developer to grant the successfully transferred water rights to the County as a condition of providing Utility water service; and

WHEREAS, OSE may require the County and developer to be co-applicants on permit applications to transfer water rights to County points of diversion and to County purposes and places of use or it may otherwise be in the County's interest to be a co-applicant; and

WHEREAS, where a developer requests water service from the County Utility, the County requires the developer to prosecute the water rights transfer and to bear all costs associated with the transfer, which duty is typically expressed in a water rights delivery agreement or other appropriate contract ("Transfer Agreement") between the County and the developer; and

WHEREAS, in cases where a Transfer Agreement is in place, the County Manager or the County Manager's delegate already has the authority to sign a water rights transfer application as a co-applicant and to otherwise perform the Transfer Agreement on behalf of the County; and

WHEREAS, because the water rights transfer process may require one or more years to complete, developers who will require new water service from the County Utility occasionally request the County to join the developer as a co-applicant on a water rights transfer application before formal execution of any Transfer Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Resolution is to delegate authority to the County Manager to sign a water rights transfer application on behalf of the County as a coapplicant with a developer where no Transfer Agreement is in place and the developer is requesting new water service from the County Utility within the Utility's service area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners as follows:


- 1. Where a developer is requesting new water service from the County Utility within the Utility's service area, and solely for the purpose of allowing the developer to commence the water rights transfer process as soon as practicable, the County Manager may sign a water rights transfer application on behalf of the County as a co-applicant with the developer notwithstanding the absence of any Transfer Agreement between the County and the developer.
- 2. The developer shall solely be responsible for prosecuting the water rights transfer and shall bear the full expense of such transfer, including but not limited to filing fees, notice fees, attorney's fees, and all witness fees.
- 3. Notwithstanding the County's status as a co-applicant on a water rights transfer application, the County shall have no obligation whatsoever concerning the water rights transfer, no obligation to participate in the water rights transfer process, and no obligation to accept any grant of water rights subject to the transfer except as may be provided in a fully executed Transfer Agreement between the County and the developer.


- 4. Where the County is a co-applicant with a developer on an application to transfer water rights to County points of diversion and County purposes and places of use, the County Manager may in his or her discretion authorize County staff to participate in the transfer proceeding and may perform such other tasks as the County Manager deems necessary or appropriate to protect or advance the County's interests in the proceeding.
- 5. The County's status as a co-applicant on a water rights transfer application shall not constitute or imply approval or favorable consideration by the County of any application, proposal, agreement, or any other submittal required under the County Sustainable Land Development Code or any other County ordinance, resolution, or policy.

Dear New Mexico Health Councils and Community Partners,

This letter is to provide clarification regarding the upcoming fiscal year 2017 funding. As you most likely know, the Governor's Office authorized a 6% reduction on all fiscal year 2017 contracts from fiscal year 2016. What this means is that each Health Council will receive a total of \$9,400. (\$10,000 - \$600).

Due to many uncertainties in the State's revenue projections and DOH's budget numbers, the DOH Cabinet Secretary Designate has given further direction to us to limit the initial six month encumbrances to 45% of original amounts. This means that for now, \$4,230 of your funding is available to you. It is my hope that by January 2017, we will have the approval to encumber the remaining 55% or \$5,170. So as you plan for this funding, please look to the \$9,400 project with the \$4,230 portion being the first phase.

Upon acceptance of this funding, Health Councils will be asked to submit a proposal, describing a scope of work building upon the work of previous years in which the Health Council would like to pursue for FY 17. We appreciate short, concise proposals of 1-2 pages. Please turn in your scope of work to your Regional Community Health Improvement Coordinator or designated Health Promotion Specialist by August 1, 2016. Similarly, if you want to decline this funding, please let this individual know by August 1, 2016.

This process of inviting Health Councils to design a targeted scope of work is to further engage County and Tribal Health Councils and respective partners to move forward with current strategic action plans. The following are suggestions your Health Council might want to consider in the development of a scope of work. The intent is to support the significant work conducted over past fiscal years.

- Utilize community input, community health assessments, planning, coordination, identified health issues & priorities, and any policy work.
- Focus on Health Council priorities identified within your most recent Health/Action/Strategic Plan.
- Review community input and community identified priorities that stemmed from the extensive community engagement sessions via the NM Health System Innovation Design (SIM) process. Additionally, take some time to review those partners identified, that could be involved to guide your future efforts of identifying strategies to work toward addressing population health through the integration of social services with health care.
- Identify one priority to focus on for FY 17 where research and implementation of best practices is attainable.

The Health Promotion Program will continue to provide support, technical assistance and, should there be a need, offer examples of a scope of work. ### Issue:

The Santa Fe County Sheriff's Office is requesting a budget increase to the United States Marshals grant by \$2,941 and a decrease to the DWI Seizure Program grant by \$18,300 for a net fund decrease of \$15,359.

### Background:

During the budget process it is necessary to estimate grant amounts that may be available to carry over to the following fiscal year. Once actual expenses and encumbrances are determined by fiscal year end, it may be necessary to adjust grant budgets to reflect actual amounts available to carry over. The fiscal year 2017 estimated grant carry over amount for the United States Marshals grant was \$4,500, however the actual amount to carry over is \$7,441. Therefore, the Sheriff's Office is requesting an increase to 246-1232 by the difference of \$2,941.

The DWI Seizure Program grant was budgeted at \$38,500 however, the actual amount available to carry over is \$20,200. The Sheriff's Office is requesting a decrease of \$18,300 to 246-1233.

### Action Requested:

The Sheriff's Office is requesting a budget increase to the US Marshals grant by \$2,941 and a decrease to the DWI Seizure grant by \$18,300 for an overall budget decrease of \$15,359.





It addresses legislation to support amendments to better define the definition of "good faith" by requiring some minimal threshold of evidence to file a claim, narrow the definition of "retaliatory action," limit "unlawful or improper act(s)" to violations of state or federal law, and narrow the universe of individuals to whom a complaint may be communicated as a precondition to filing a claim.

This resolution was voted on during the August 4, 2016 New Mexico Association of Counties meeting.

# A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE NEW MEXICO ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES' RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE NEW MEXICO WHISTLEBLOWER PROTECTION ACT DURING THE 2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Whistleblower Protection Act ("Act"), NMSA 1978, Sections 10-16C-1 through 10-16C-6, was enacted by the New Mexico Legislature in 2010; and

WHEREAS, the Act was intended to prohibit public employers from retaliating against public employees who take action, object to, or refuse to participate in a matter the employee believes, in good faith, to be an unlawful or improper act; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Association of Counties (NMAC") has resolved in Managers Affiliate Resolution No. 1 ("NMAC Resolution") to support legislation during the 2017 Legislative Session that would amend the Act to: (a) better define "good faith" by requiring some minimal threshold of evidence for an employee to file a claim under the Act; (b) narrow the definition of "retaliatory action" as the current definition encompasses any "adverse employment action against a public employee"; (c) limit "unlawful or improper act(s)" to violations of state or federal law; and (d) narrow the universe of individuals to whom a complaint may be communicated as a precondition to filing a claim under the Act.



### BACKGROUND

This Resolution addresses legislation to support recommendations that allow local Board of County Commissioners to: accept, approve, and review non-governmental entities' capital outlay funds and their fiscal impacts to county's finances prior to submission to the state legislature; suspend acceptance of 2017 legislative session capital outlay funds for purchase of vehicles, information technology, and any capital outlay expenditure of less than \$50,000; and authorize the collection of a 3% administrative fee.

This resolution was voted on during the August 4, 2016 New Mexico Association of Counties meeting.

A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE NEW MEXICO
ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES' RESOLUTION SUPPORTING
LEGISLATION DURING THE 2017 SESSION THAT WOULD
PROVIDE COUNTIES CERTAIN RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS
REGARDING CAPITAL OUTLAY APPROPRIATIONS TO
NON-GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES

WHEREAS, the New Mexico State Legislature appropriates capital outlay funds to various non-governmental entities, such as not-for-profit or non-profit agencies; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Mexico funds capital outlay projects with severance tax bonds, resulting in increased regulations and responsibilities for counties to comply with State-imposed conditions in regards to contracts, anti-donation issues, contract monitoring, accounting, and reporting requirements; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico Association of Counties (NMAC") has resolved in Economic Development and Infrastructure Policy Committee No. 1 ("NMAC Resolution") to support legislation during the 2017 Legislative Session that would: (a) recommend that acceptance of capital outlay funds on behalf of nongovernmental entities should require approval of the governing body of the affected county prior to submission to any member of the State Legislature; (b) require any project presented by non-governmental entities to be reviewed for its fiscal impact to the affected county's current and recurring finances; (c) allow county governing bodies to suspend acceptance of 2017 Legislative Session capital outlay funds on behalf of nongovernmental entities for purchase of vehicles and information technology and any capital outlay expenditure less than \$50,000; and (d) authorize county governing bodies to approve the collection of a three percent (3%) administrative fee based on the amount of capital outlay from any nongovernmental entity with whom the county enters into an agreement to expend capital outlay funds beginning with the 2017 State Legislative Session appropriations, but allowing the administrative fee to be waived or modified by majority vote of the governing body.
