RESOLUTION NO. 2013-

A RESOLUTION DISSEMINATING TO THE PUBLIC DETAILED INFORMATION CONCERNING THE COUNTY'S IMPOSITION OF PROPERTY TAXES AND THE LIMITATIONS IMPOSED ON PROPERTY TAX RATES BY STATUTE ("YIELD CONTROL")

- INTRODUCED BY COMMISSIONER MAYFIELD -

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is empowered by the New Mexico Property Tax Code, NMSA 1978, Title 7, Chapters 35 through 38 to enact a property tax levy to support County operations;

WHEREAS, the maximum property tax rate that may be established for any county is eleven dollars and eight-five cents (\$11.85) for each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of net taxable value of both residential and nonresidential property ...", except for special levies otherwise authorized by Law and County general obligation bond debt service;

WHEREAS, by statute, the tax rate (subject to the maximum rate described in the previous paragraph) is established in any given year through the County budgeting process, but is also subject to annual limitations on residential tax rates established in NMSA 1978, Section 7-37-7.1, commonly known as "yield control";

WHEREAS, yield control applies a complex formula to control the rate of growth of property tax revenue over time, which based in-part on the implicit price deflator index for state and local government purchases of goods and services as published by the United States Department of Commerce, and in part on the ratio of new residential properties to existing residential properties, all as set forth in NMSA 1978, Section 7-37-7.1;

WHEREAS, the effective residential real property tax rates in Santa Fe County have historically been much less than the statutory maximum of \$11.85/\$1,000 because of the effects of yield control and conservative budgeting by the Board of County Commissioners;

WHEREAS, although the Board of County Commissioners has limited control over increases in the property tax rate when yield control is being applied, it does have authority to reduce the property tax rate and has done so at least once in recent decades (see e.g. Ordinance No. 1997-8 ("An Ordinance Requiring Reduction in the Mill Levy by July 1, 1998"));

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners values transparency and openness in government and, even though complex, the components of the property tax are important matters of public concern which should be readily available to the public and presented in an understandable manner;

WHEREAS, the annual calculation of property tax rates is a highly technical activity that occurs within a statutory five day window each September and, although technical information is disseminated to the public at that time, no guidance is provided to the public how to interpret the information and in particular how the public is supposed to know how the tax rates compare with prior years, what the effective and actual tax rate is, how residential rates and nonresidential rates compare, and other important matters; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners believes that the residents of Santa Fe County are entitled to know how property taxes are computed, what the limitations are and how they are applied, and basic information how the rates are developed and that information should be developed and placed into a simple and understandable format, and disseminated to the public as well as updated as important changes are made.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Manager and staff are instructed to disseminate to the public in an easily understandable format on the County's internet web site (www.santafecounty.org) information concerning the County's annual operating property tax levy, including all available historical information concerning the tax rates over time, information concerning the computation of property taxes in any given year, information concerning limitations on property taxation and how the limitations are applied, and basic information how the property tax rates are developed (in a simple and understandable format), what the effective tax rate is in any given year, how residential rates and nonresidential rates compare, and additional information each time the information changes (such as when tax rates are established for subsequent tax years).

A RESOLUTION REQUIRING STAFF TO PREPARE A LIST OF ALL REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY SANTA FE COUNTY

- INTRODUCED BY COMMISSIONER MAYFIELD -

WHEREAS, Santa Fe County owns thousands of acres of real property spread over 1,200 square miles;

WHEREAS, County holdings include office buildings, jails, law enforcement and fire facilities, two county courthouses, community centers, senior centers, and solid waste facilities, as well as unoccupied ranches, trails, open space, undeveloped land, conservation easements, and land encumbered by conservation easements:

WHEREAS, Santa Fe County both leases land to third parties and leases land and buildings from third parties;

WHEREAS, County staff does not at the present time have a complete list, chart or spreadsheet of all of County-owned real property, nor of details concerning the disposition of properties on the list or other important details of the status of the properties;

WHEREAS, it is critical to management of the properties owned by the County to understand what the County owns, its precise status, details concerning its operation and management, risks or special conditions that the properties present, and, with respect to leased properties, the details of the leases such as revenue, options, duration, and insurance requirements;

WHEREAS, proper management of County-owned property is important because some properties the County owns may not be adequately maintained and may present risk management or insurance coverage issues, and properties that are not even not recognized as being owned by the County present obvious risk management and insurance coverage issues;

WHEREAS, proper financial management of County-owned property is also required by New Mexico statutes, particularly as it relates to tracking of fixed assets, auditing and accountability;

WHEREAS, some properties have water rights associated with the property that must be tracked, used, and encompassed within the forty-year water plan to protect the rights from claims of forfeiture or abandonment;

WHEREAS, the County's management of its properties would be enhanced if all the details concerning each County property were on a common list, chart or spreadsheet; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to instruct staff to research the status of each County property and prepare such a list, chart or spreadsheet to be transmitted to the Board, the County Manager, the Finance Director, the County Attorney and the Risk Manager.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Staff shall research the status of each County real property and prepare such a complete list, chart or spreadsheet of all of County-owned real property. The list shall include all relevant details concerning the property, including the location, improvements, restrictions applicable to the property, the current value, purchase price, whether the property is held under lease (and if so, the terms of the lease, the rent, any deadlines for exercising options under the lease, and other relevant information), appurtenant water rights, whether the property has been leased to another entity (and if so, the terms of the lease, the rent, any deadlines for exercising options under the lease, details concerning the operation and management of the properties, risks or special conditions that the properties present, whether the property is presently insured, and other relevant information).
- 2. Staff should provide relevant copies of important documents along with the list, chart or spreadsheet (including deeds, contracts, title insurance policies, surveys, environmental assessments, leases, easements, encroachments).
- 3. The information required to be gathered shall be transmitted to the Board of County Commissioners, the County Manager, the County Finance Director, the County Attorney and the County Risk Manager.


