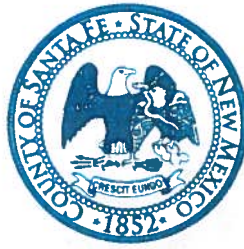

Re: SFC Corrections Department Monthly Report for May 2013

The purpose of this memo is to provide you information relative to the SFC Corrections Department for the month of May 2013. During the month of May, the Detention Officer vacancy rate was 7% with 27 vacant positions, and 5 new hires. There were 755 bookings and 749 releases.

Adult Detention Facility

- Presentation of Medical by Lisa Leiding, RN Administrator.
- SFC Corrections Academy Class #24 began on May 20, 2013 with 14 ADF and 2 YDP employees.
- 1,211 inmate program classes were offered in the month of May with 2,227 inmates participating in program classes.
- Facility has provided 101 transports since implementation in November 2012 for released inmates with 21 transported in the month of May.
- An estimated total of \$567,624.00 was billed for the month of May.
- 89% of revenue billed has been received for 2013 (\$4,944,173 billed/\$3,932,638 received).

Youth Development Program

- Science Technology Career presentation was held on May 29, 2013.
- An estimated total of \$67,822.15 was billed for the month of May.
- 94% of revenue billed has been received for 2013 (\$534,821 billed/\$478,348 received).

Electronic Monitoring

- Absconding offenders has decreased by 3% from April 2013.
- Out of County revenue has increased by 4%.
- The average population in Electronic Monitoring was 259 for the month. Revenue received for May was \$17,562.29.

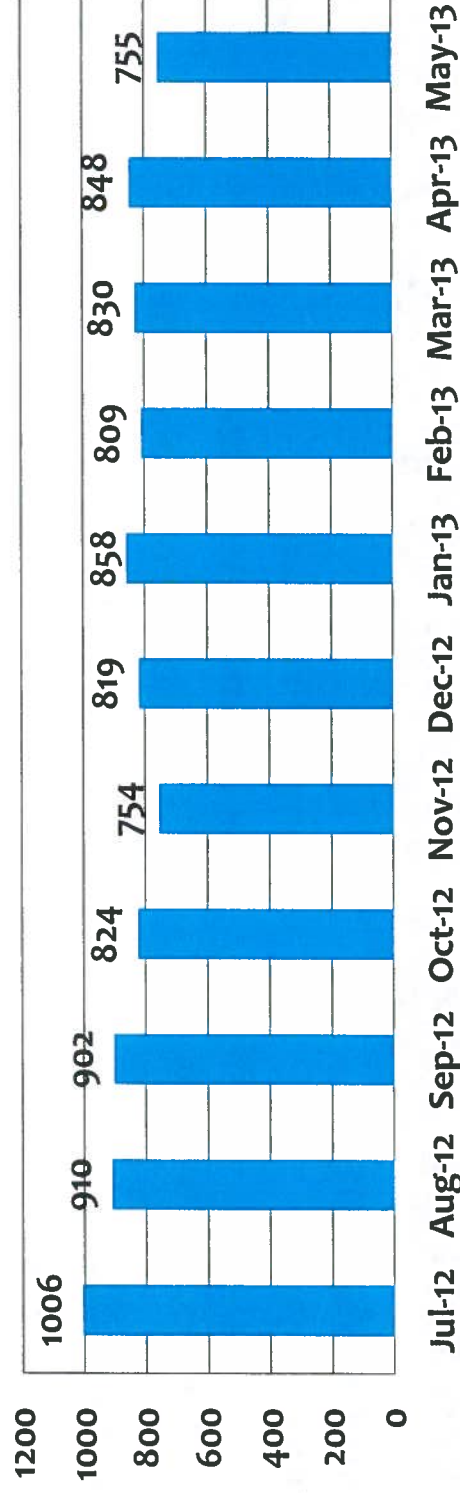

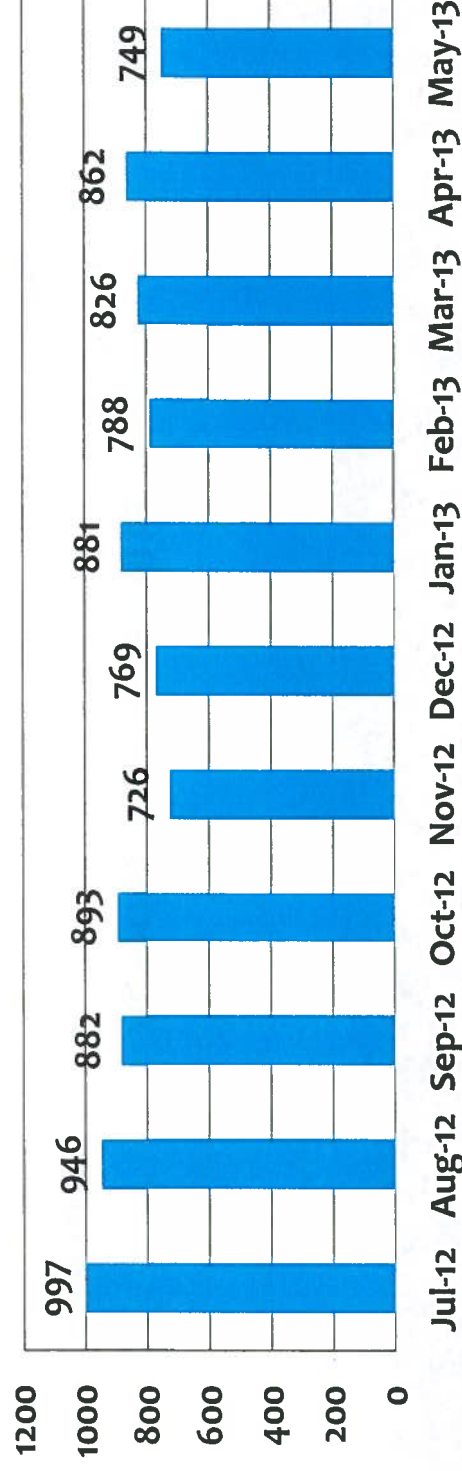
SFC - Adult Facility's July 2012 Thru May 2013- Bookings TOTAL POPULATION

July 2012 Thru April 2013 Bookings - Total Population



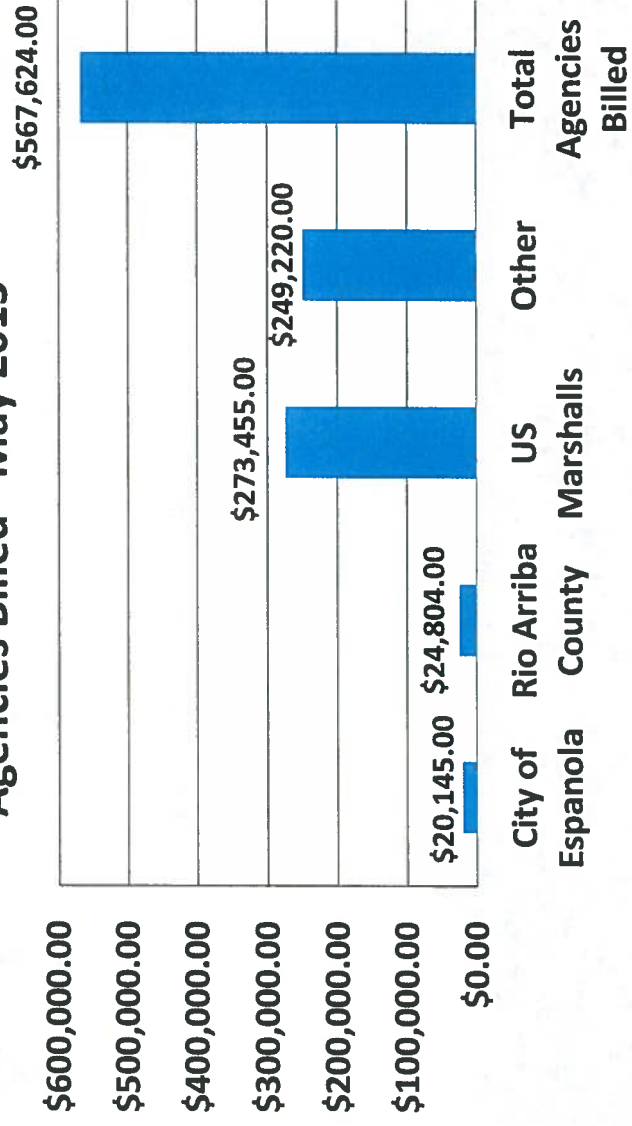
SFC - Adult Facility's July 2012 Thru May 2013 Releases TOTAL POPULATION

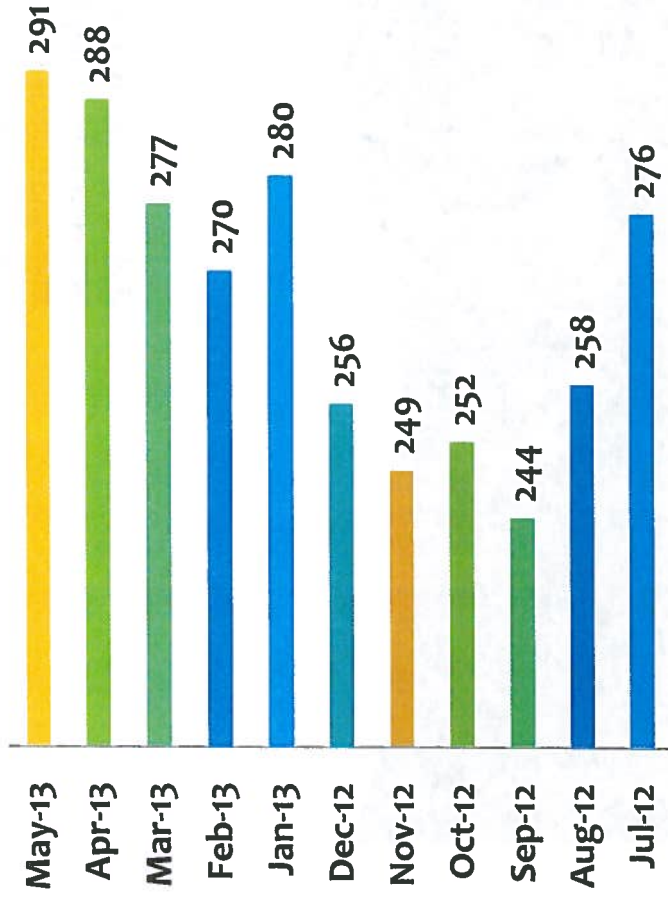

2013 Billing and Current (06/07/13) Revenue for April 2013

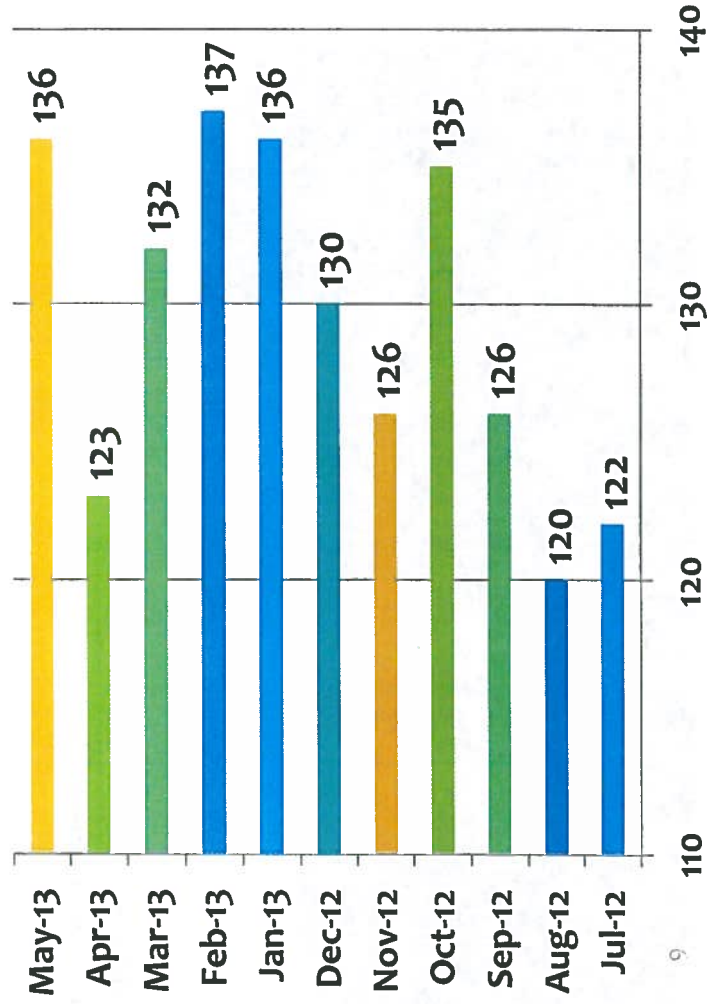

July 2012 thru May 2013

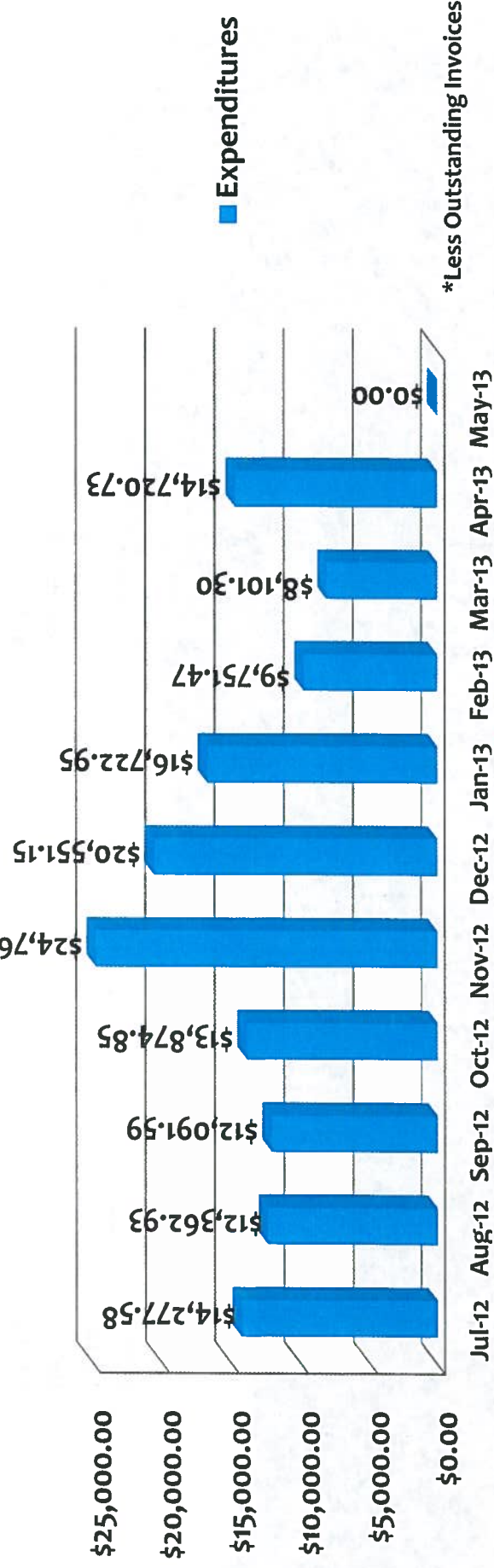

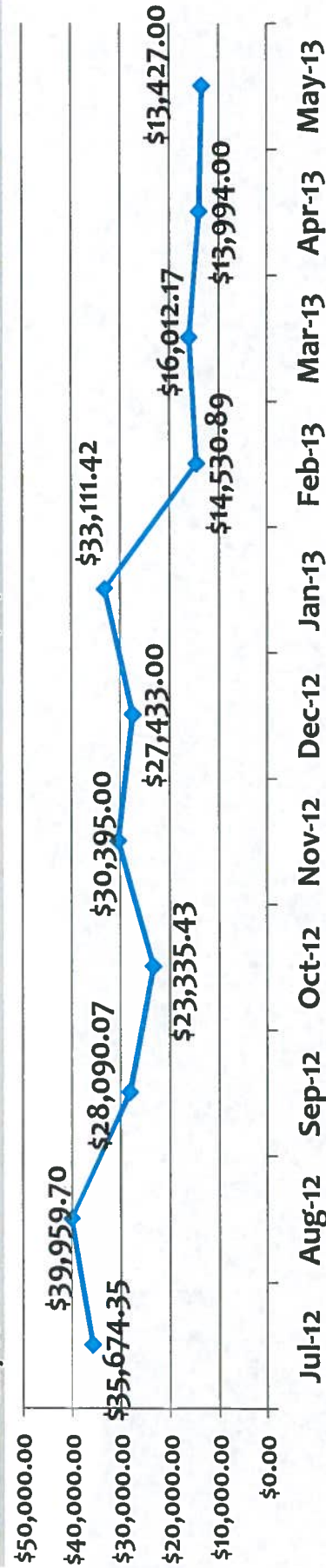

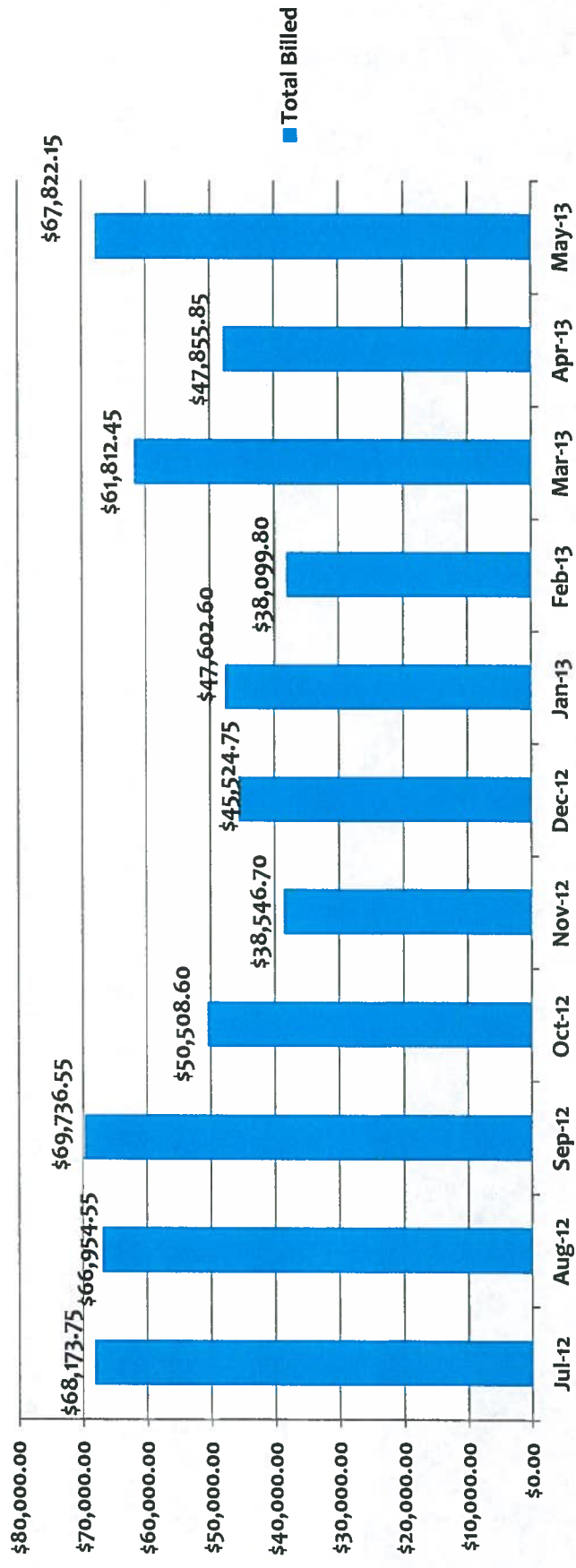

Youth Development Program Percentage of Revenue

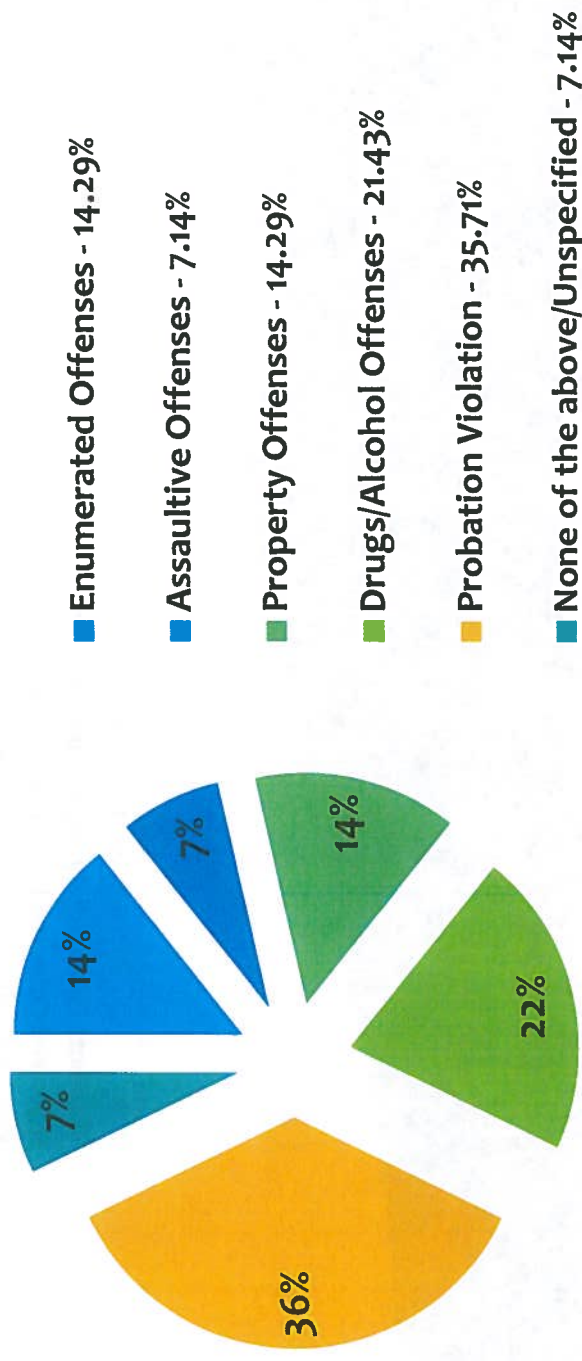

May 2013**



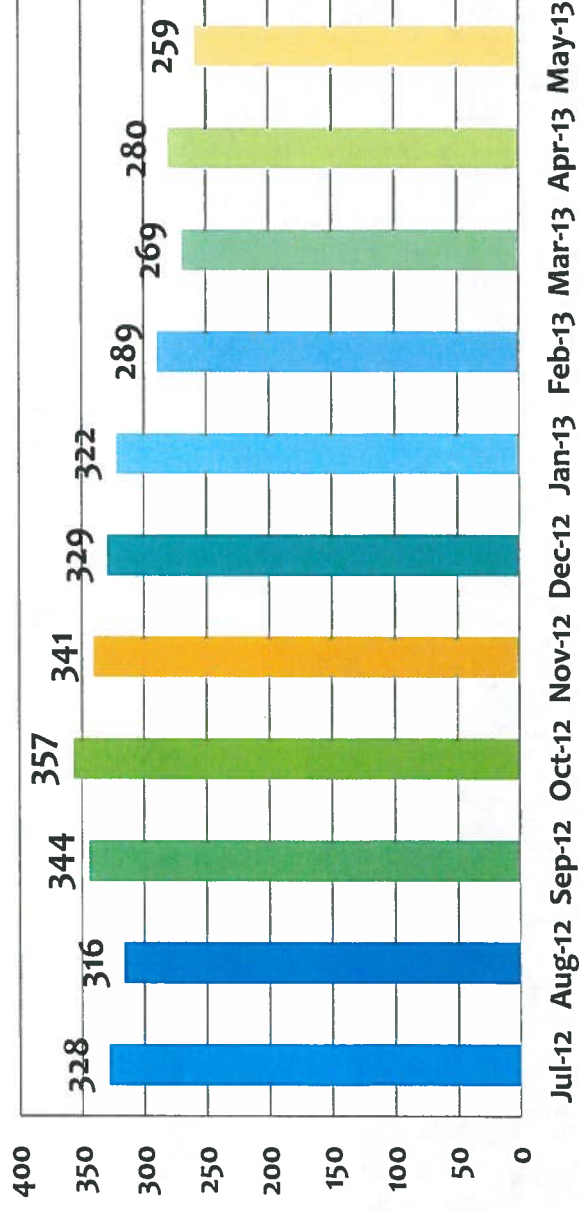

Total Population - July 2012 to May 2013

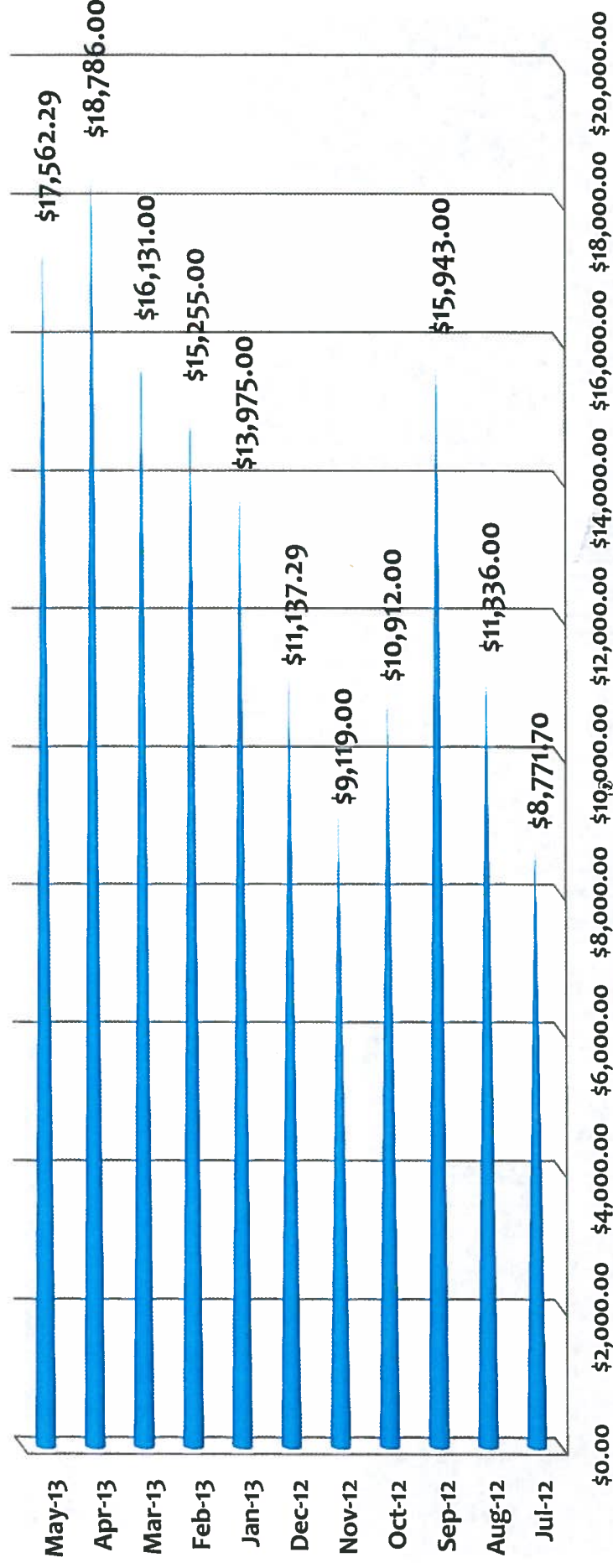

Revenue (July 2012 Thru May 2013)

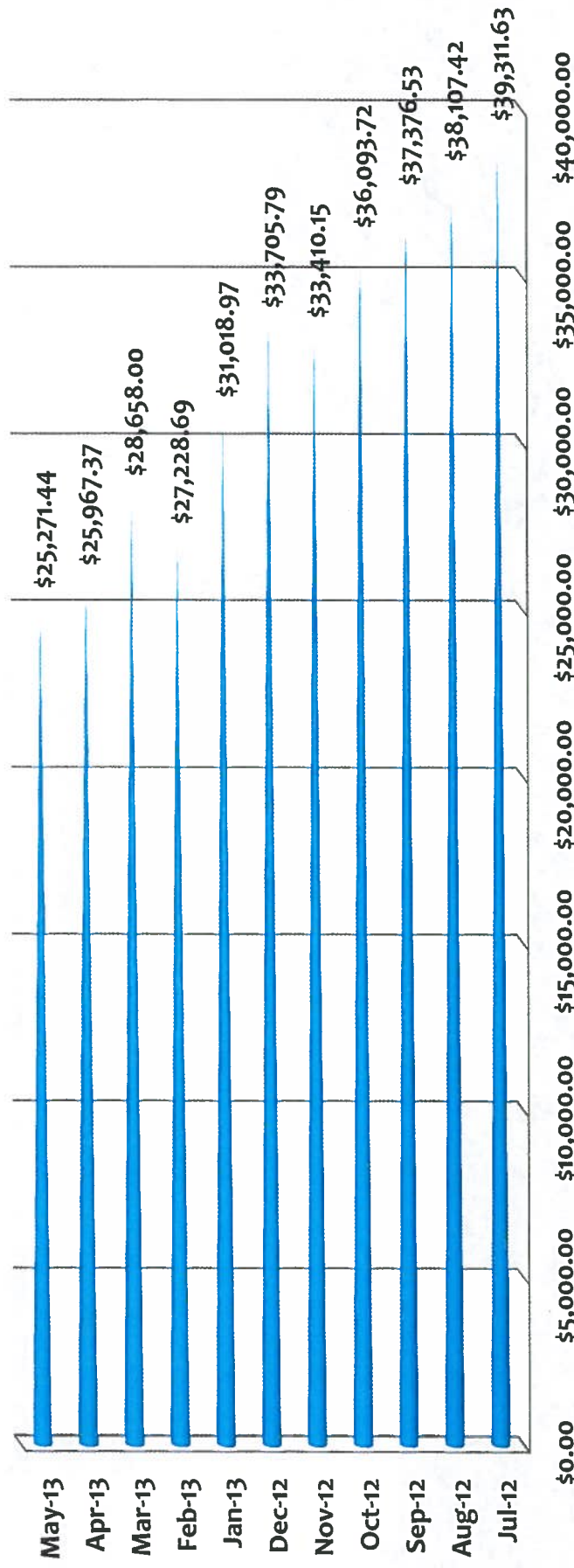

(July 2012 Thru May 2013)

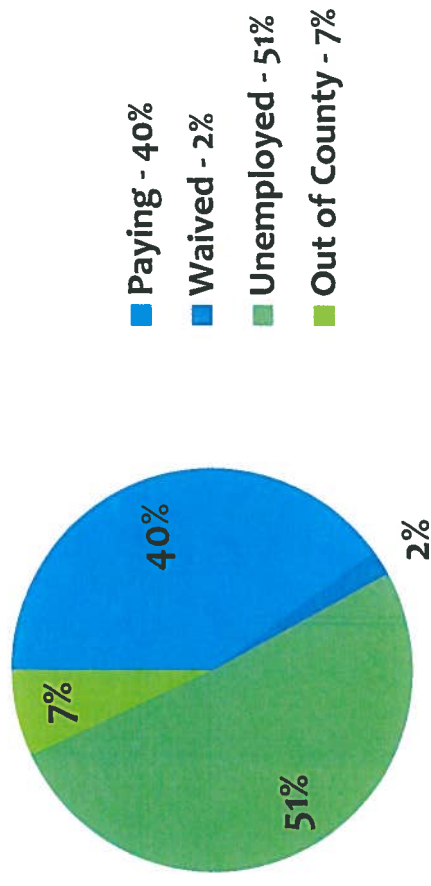
Electronic Monitoring

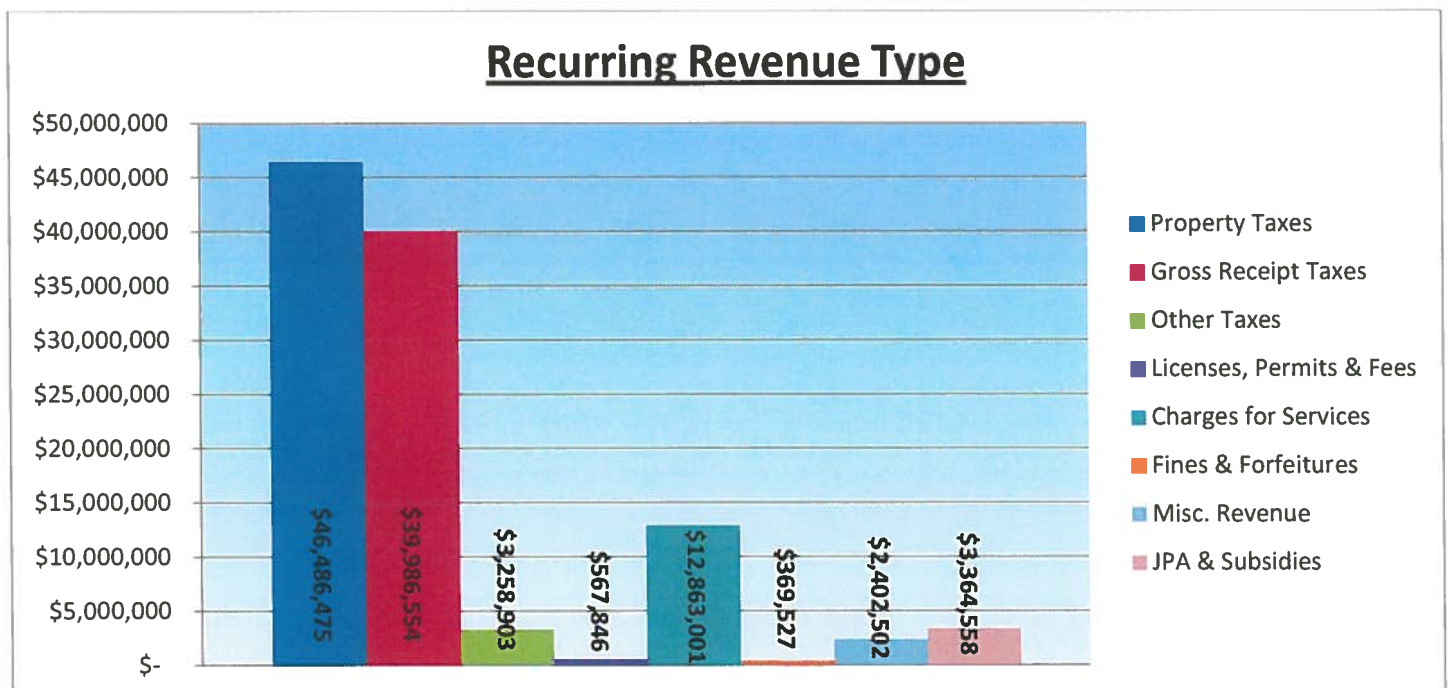

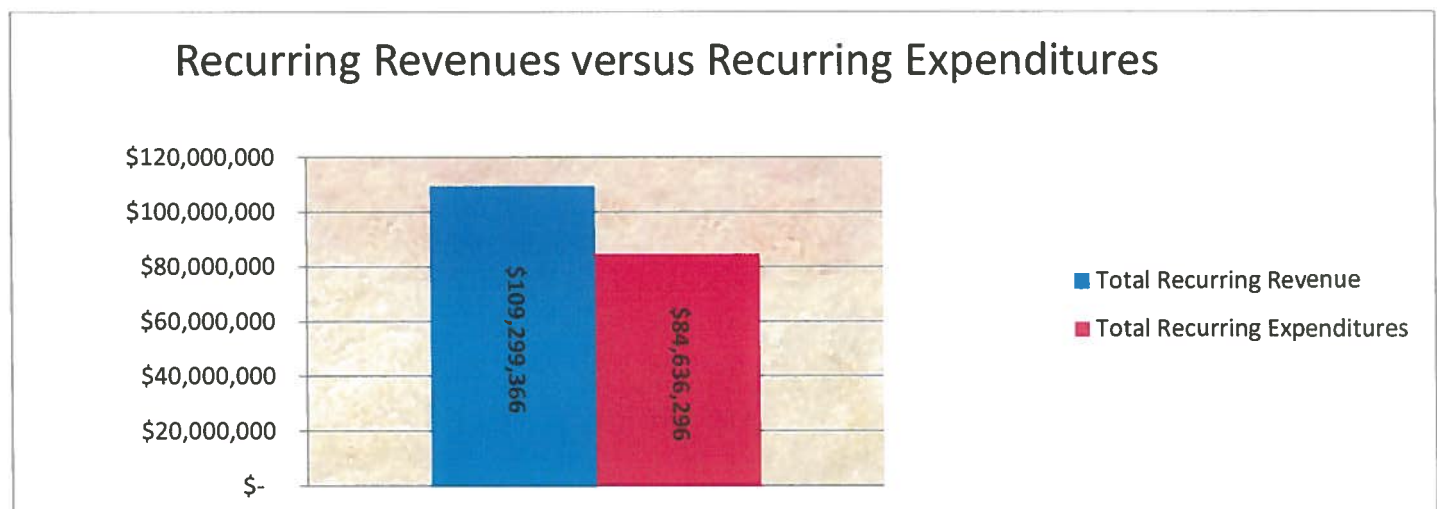
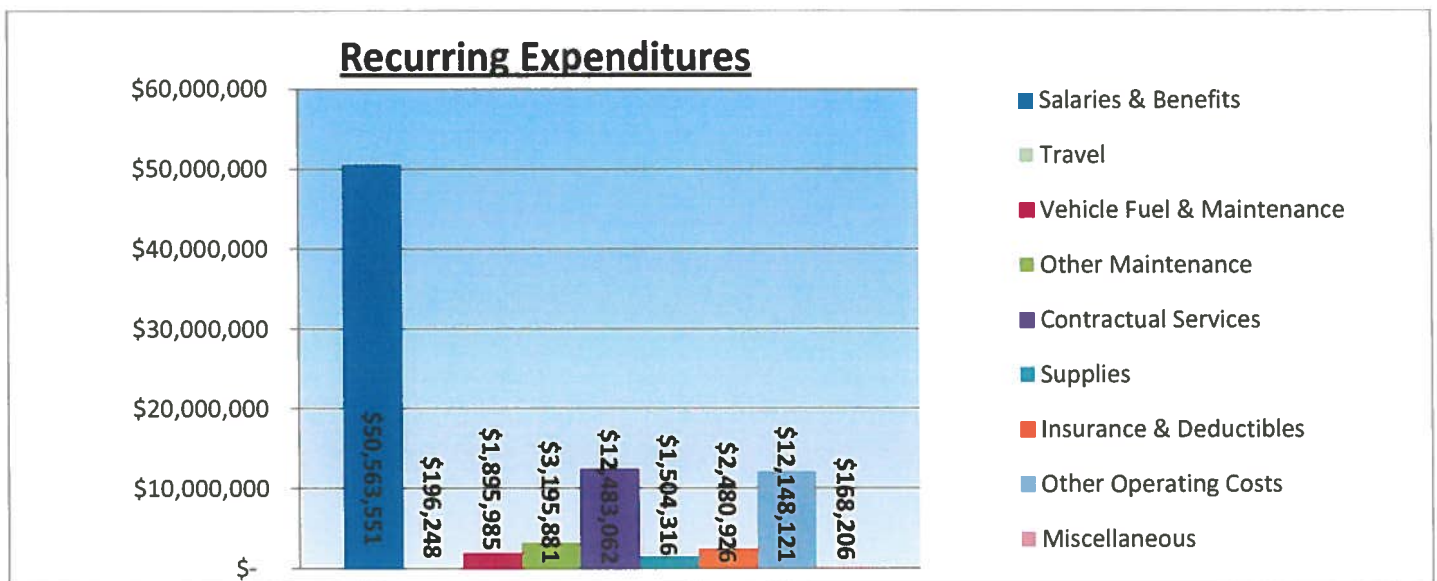
Enclosed is a report summarizing the financial activities of the County through the month ending May 31, 2013.

BACKGROUND:

This is a comparison of revenues and expenditures on a recurring versus non-recurring basis. The monthly report will still highlight major revenue sources. Below are several charts that identify 1) the recurring revenue sources, 2) the recurring expenditures and 3) a comparison of the two side by side.

RECURRING VERSUS NON-RECURRING





Through the month of May, as noted in the charts above, there were sufficient revenues of \$109.3 million to accommodate total expenditures of \$84.6 million. Property tax revenue collections through the month of May are 7% and gross receipt tax collections are 5% better than the budgeted amount.

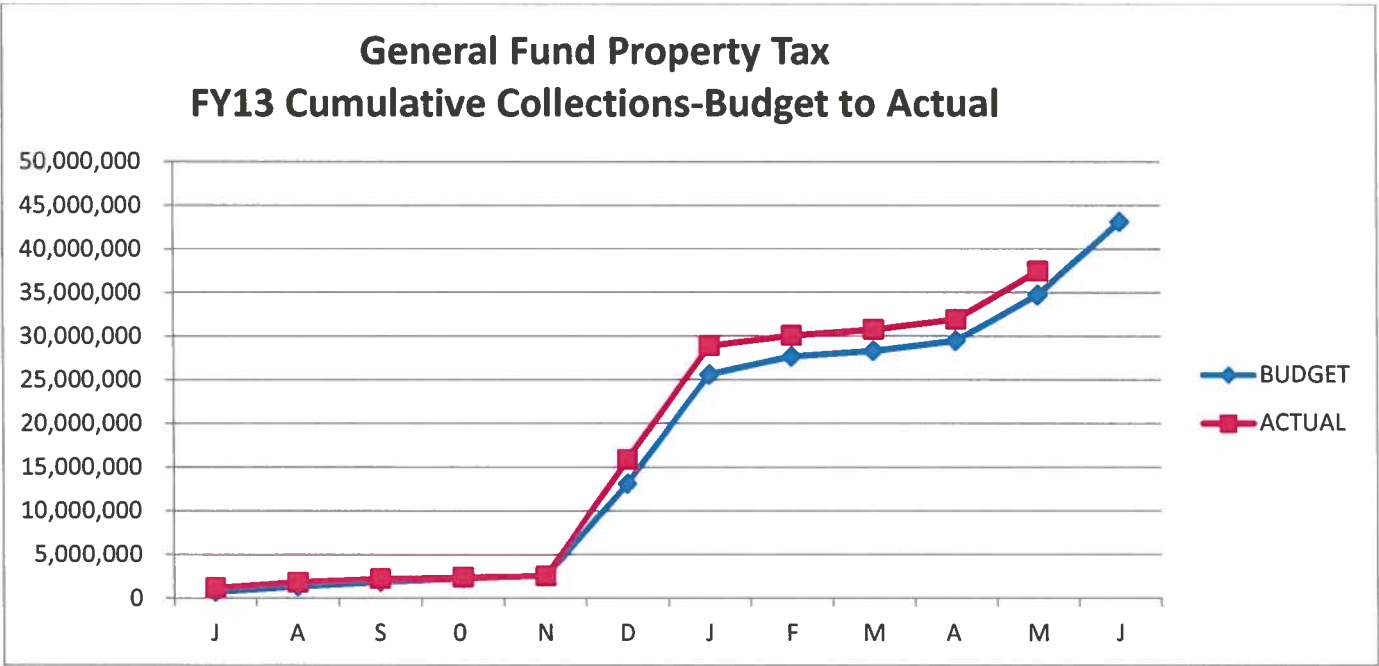
Also included for your information are the charts reflecting major revenue sources and collections through May.

REVENUE:

Property tax is recorded monthly and compared to the actual monthly budget forecasts. Property tax revenue budget estimates are conservative, as a budget shortfall in tax receipts would have a serious

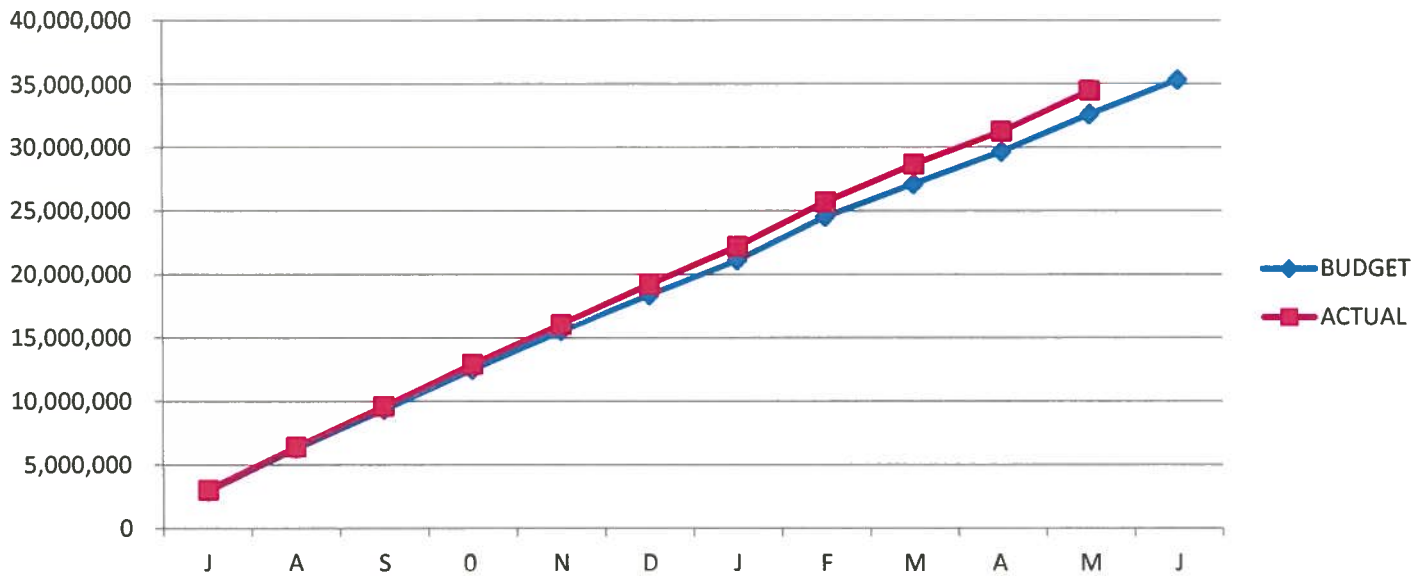
impact on various County operations. In FY2013, revenue projections supported a very modest increase in property tax revenue, estimates were increased by \$1.5 million or 4%. In reviewing collections year-to-date, the collections have exceeded budget cumulatively by \$2.7 million. It is important to note that the collections have materialized just a little better than budget for the months of July through November and then began to significantly exceed budget in December and January. Collections for the month of May materialized better than budget and June has \$8.0 million budgeted and still to materialize.

Actual property tax collections (exclusive of debt service property tax collections) of \$37.4 million through the end of May exceeded the budget by \$2.7 million. The chart below includes collections through May, which are \$634K or 1.7% greater than the prior year's collections for the same time period.



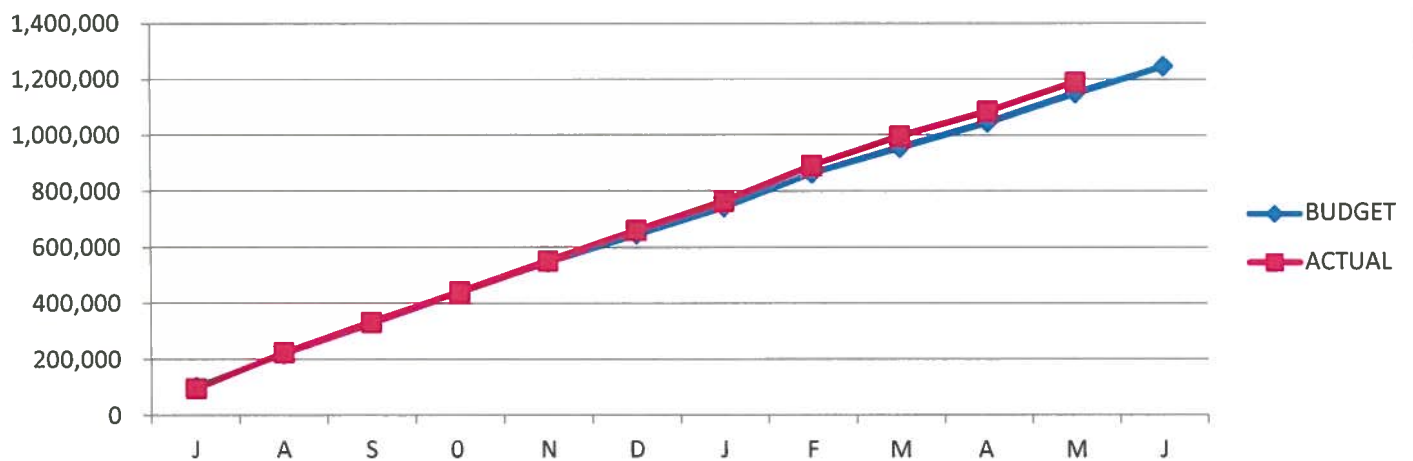
The gross receipts taxes are estimated from trend data and from economic analysis of the business activities in the areas of construction, wholesale, retail and service sectors. Gross receipts taxes appear to have stabilized and were budgeted flat, with the exception of a 10% reduction to the unincorporated gross receipt taxes. Combined, both the county-wide and the unincorporated gross receipt taxes collected through May total \$35.6 million and are \$1.9 million, or 5%, greater than the budgeted amount of \$33.7 million. Total collections fell below the prior year by \$163K for the same time period.

The actual unincorporated GRT collections for FY 2012 consistently fell below the forecasted budget level. In FY 2013 total unincorporated GRTs collections have exceeded the budgeted amount of \$1.1 million by \$39,736. Small amounts of money, mainly penalty and interest, relative to delinquent collections for the sunsetted Fire Excise Tax are still materializing. A total of \$38,525 was collected through the month of May. The total unincorporated GRT collections through May are \$1.189 million, which are \$39,736 or 3.5% above budget, and \$64,179 or 5.1% below the prior year collections.

NON-RECURRING EXPENDITURES

Capital expenditures are non-recurring expenditures funded by non-recurring sources. Such sources include bond proceeds, special appropriations, grants and cash balances from excess revenues of prior years. The capital expenditures incurred through the month of May 2013 total \$37.4 million.

ITEM AND ISSUE: PUBLIC WORKS MONTHLY REPORT FOR MAY 2013

DISCUSSION

Capital Project Delivery

We are currently managing 92 capital projects. On July 1, 2013, with the beginning of the new fiscal year and the FY14 capital budget, we will be adding an additional 24 projects to this list. Notable milestones in our successful execution of this program are listed below.

Projects nearing completion include the Edgewood Senior Center Garden, the Esperanza Women's Shelter Building upgrades, and kitchen upgrades at the Adult Detention Facility. Both Cundiyo Center Parking Lot and South Meadows Open Space (Phase 1) designs are 100% complete and construction on both should begin within the next two months. La Cienega Fire Station 1 Renovation project construction will start in July with the contract approval at the June 11, 2013, BCC meeting.

The State Mining and Minerals Division is funding and building a stormwater management project in Madrid. The State is expecting the County to assume operations and maintenance responsibilities once the project is complete, though no formal communications have been made nor agreements drafted. A public meeting on the project was held on May 29th in Madrid, and the public was largely supportive of the design concept that was presented.

Public Works staff met with the Espanola School Board to discuss disposition of the Bennie J. Chavez Center in Chimayo. During the meeting, the school board expressed an interest in selling the center to the County; we are currently working on the details of such a transaction.

Public Works staff had a break-through with site selection for the Highway 14 Senior Center. The ideal site that had been identified near the junction with CR 42 was thought to be initially unavailable due to neighbor resistance but is now back on the table. We expect to be able to purchase the land by the end of the summer.

We've completed negotiations on design services for Herrada Road in Eldorado and CR54 Los Pinos Road All-Weather Crossing in La Cienega. We received a proposal for additional design services to increase the

scope of the Old Santa Fe Trail Bike Lane contract to include the portion within the City of Santa Fe's limits; this is being pursued as part of a possible "project swap" with the City.

We completed the site visit and scope of work discussions with the Office of Archaeological Studies Center for New Mexico Archaeology to provide a fee proposal for cultural concerns for the Torcido Loop Road Upgrade and the CR54 Los Pinos All-Weather Crossing projects.

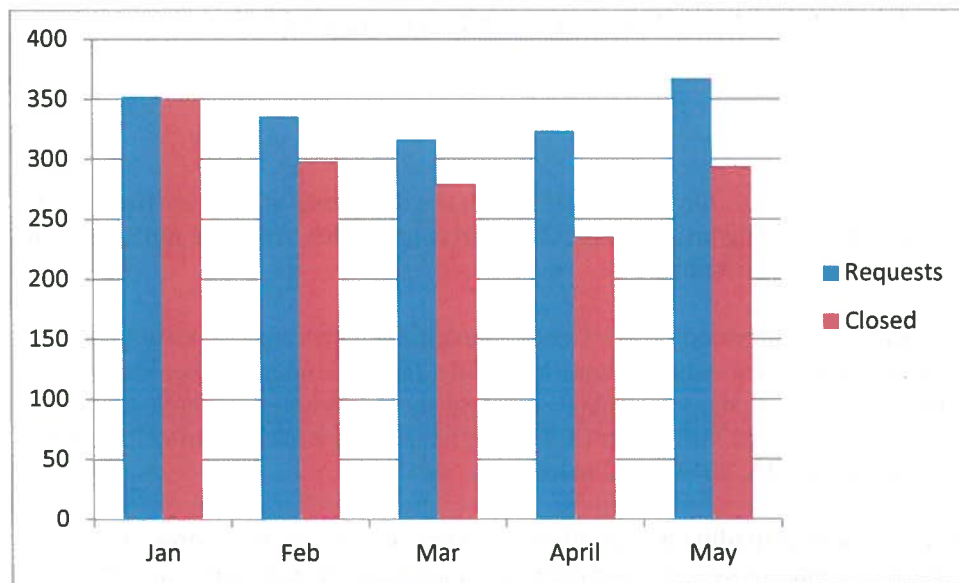
The Canoncito waterline project designs are continuing apace and are approximately 30% complete. We expect to be able to go out to bid for construction in early October.

Public Works is working with the County Attorney to complete deed of easement from Commonwealth Conservancy for 18 miles of trail and 3 trailheads in the Galisteo Basin Preserve south of Eldorado.

Information on all active projects can be found in the attached Table 1: Capital Project Status Update.

Operation and Maintenance

Work order completion rates continue to be high, as seen at Table 2 (attached). The chart below shows that May was a high work order month. This was due mainly to an increase in traffic work requests for sign repairs, work zone coordination, and traffic counts.



Public Works staff trimmed trees on Ellis Ranch Road in District 4 and on Camino Chupadero CR 84, CR 106, CR 113S, and CR 115 in District 1. Potholes were patched on Camino Vista Grande in Eldorado and a culvert was installed under CR 106 in District 1 for a local acequia.

Public Works staff and Commissioner Mayfield met with representatives of the Jacona Land Grant to discuss siting a new solid waste transfer station on the land grant. The land grant representatives asked for a presentation of what a transfer station would look like; this presentation is scheduled for June 13. Meanwhile, the solid waste team hauled 789 tons to Caja del Rio Landfill in May, which is slightly below average.

Utilities

An odor complaint from a Camino Vista Aurora resident in Agua Fria Village was determined to be the responsibility of the City of Santa Fe Wastewater Division to correct and was referred to that agency. This problem highlighted the continued confusion surrounding wastewater service in the traditional village that hopefully the annexation process will solve.

We are continuing to work with the Turquoise Trail Master Association (TTMA) to finalize the takeover of their wastewater assets that was approved by the BCC in March. TTMA is addressing about \$25k punchlist items, and we have a project to install a new force main to tie this system into our larger system. This will allow the County Utility to connect about 100 new wastewater customers.

We are working with La Bajada MDWCA on their project to develop a new well as an alternate water supply. The 2012 Water Trust Board (WTB) grant extension was denied at the WTB's April 2013 meeting, and so we are exploring options for funding, keeping in mind the requirements of Resolution 2012-58. A letter was sent to the MDWCA from the County Manager in April, asking the association their intentions. The MDWCA held a membership-wide meeting on June 2 to discuss the matter, but so far nothing has been communicated back to the County.

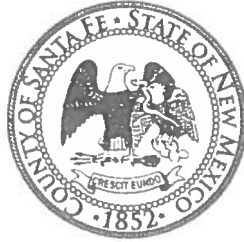

RE: HR Monthly Report for May 2013

The purpose of this memo is to provide you with information relative to HR functions and statistics for the month of May 2013. Throughout the month of May, HR coordinated/conducted 14 training sessions for approximately 105 employees. With regard to our recruitment efforts, we conducted testing for the Corporal and Sergeant positions at the Corrections Department. This testing process is for internal employees and is intended to provide promotional opportunities for current employees pursuant to the collective bargaining agreement.

In May 2013, HR negotiated financial re-openers with CWA and was successful in completing the negotiations. In addition, HR began negotiations with IAFF for their financial re-opener and continues to negotiate with AFSCME for their entire contract. Also for the month of May, HR developed many reports and scenarios to assist with the budget process relative to employee compensation. This included conducting research on other agencies.

With regard to the new fiscal year, HR has begun preparing for all the changes that will occur. These changes include benefit changes, compensation changes according to approved budget, collective bargaining agreement changes, sick leave incentive, and PERA changes. In addition, HR has been notified that the State Risk Management Division will now require bi-monthly payments for insurance benefits which are a change from our current bi-weekly schedule. We are working with them regarding this change and will keep the BCC and employees informed of any changes to include advance notice if any changes affect employees.

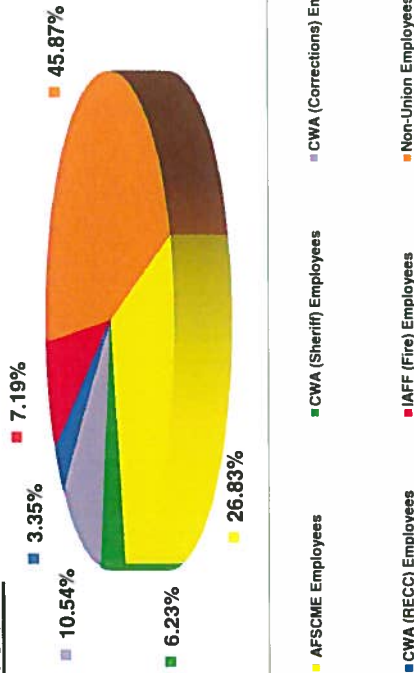

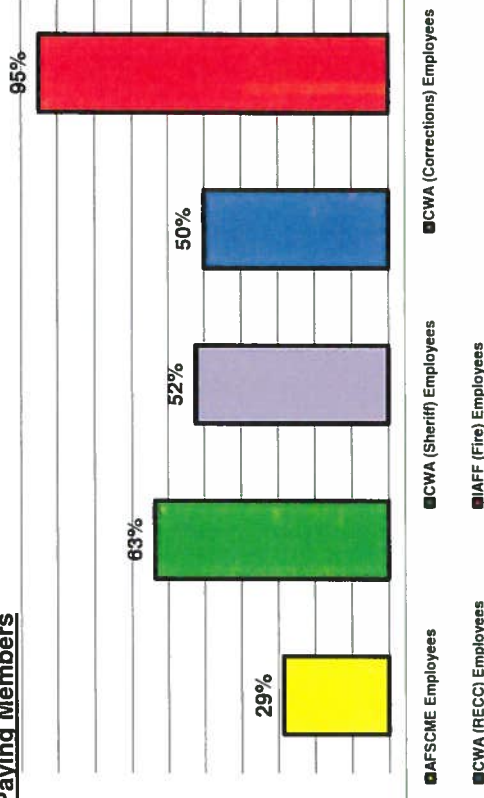

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
OF SANTA FE COUNTY THAT ORDINANCE 1992-03, AS AMENDED BY
ORDINANCE 2009-3, IS FURTHER AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:**

WHEREAS, in 1992 the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County adopted Ordinance 1992-03 requiring persons engaging in business in Santa Fe County to obtain a Santa Fe County business license;

WHEREAS, in 2009 the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 2009-3 amending Ordinance 1992-3 by transferring responsibility for issuance of business licenses from the Santa Fe County Clerk to the Santa Fe County Treasurer; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Fe County Treasurer receives regular requests for duplicate copies of business licenses, the provision of which is an expense to Santa Fe County.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SANTA FE COUNTY that Ordinance 1992-03 is hereby amended as follows.

1. Section 3(B)(3) is hereby amended by adding the following:

“Any license holder who requests a second copy of their license may obtain the duplicate license following payment of the duplicate license fee set forth in Section 3(B)(4).”

2. Section 3(B)(4) is hereby amended by adding the following:

“n. Duplicate license, six (\$6.00) dollars.”
