Bach agency shall be responsible for the acts of omissions of its employees. Participating agencies of their employees shall not be considered as the agents of any other participating agency. Nothing hardin weives or limits sovereign immunity under federal or state statutory or constitutional law.

Background and Summary

Real property (Property) located at 1071 Camino Vista Aurora appears to be an abandoned property and has not been maintained for an extended period of time. Neighboring property owners have expressed concern about the structural integrity of the dwelling and unsanitary conditions of the Property.

NMSA 1978 §42-1-18(A) authorizes an inspection officer to apply to the district court for an inspection order to conduct an inspectorial search showing that consent to an inspectorial search has been refused or is otherwise unobtainable within a reasonable period of time. To-date the County has been unable to locate the owner of record.

It has been determined that it is necessary to enter the Property for the purpose of ascertaining the existence or non-existence of conditions dangerous to health or safety or otherwise relevant to public interest, in accordance with the inspection requirements prescribed in the Sustainable Land Development Code, the Nuisance Ordinance and the Fire Code.

The proposed Resolution will authorize the application to district court for an inspection order.

Recommendation

Staff is recommending approval of the Resolution.

WHEREAS, it appears that the Property is abandoned and has not been maintained; and

WHEREAS, neighboring property owners are concerned about the structural integrity of the dwelling and unsanitary conditions on the premises of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2016-9, the Sustainable Land Development Code (SLDC); Ordinance No. 2009-11, An Ordinance to Prohibit Excessive, Unnecessary and Unreasonable Noise and Public Nuisances (Public Nuisance Ordinance); and Ordinance No. 1991-7, Fire Prevention Code, as amended by Ordinance No. 1998-11 (Fire Code) were enacted for the promotion and protection of the public well-being; and

WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, § 42-1-18(A) authorizes an inspection officer to apply to the district court for an inspection order to conduct an inspectorial search "[u]pon sufficient showing that consent to an inspectorial search has been refused or is otherwise unobtainable within a reasonable period of time"; and

WHEREAS, the Property appears to be unoccupied and, to-date, the County has been unable to locate the owner of record for the property; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to enter onto the Property for the purpose of ascertaining the existence or nonexistence of conditions dangerous to health or safety or otherwise relevant to the public interest, in accordance with inspection requirements prescribed in the SLDC, Public Nuisance Ordinance, and Fire Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners that a Santa Fe County Code Enforcement Officer may apply to the district court for an inspection order pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 42-1-18(A), to conduct an inspectorial search at the dwelling and premise located at 1071 Camino Vista Aurora if

consent to an inspectorial search has been refused or is otherwise unobtainable within a reasonable period of time.
