

Issue:

This is concerning the appointment of Maurey Lynne Walker Nash to the DWI Planning Council. Ms. Nash will be representing the Courts.

Background:

The New Mexico Legislature enacted NMSA 1978, Sections 11-6A-1 through 11-6A-6 to address the serious problems caused by Driving While Intoxicated (DWI) in the State. Funds are generated from excise tax on the sale of alcohol, collected by the New Mexico Department of Taxation and Revenue, and administered by the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA). One of the requirements is that the county receiving funds must have a County DWI Planning Council to serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of County Commissioners.

Resolution 1997-87 established the original DWI Planning Council consisting of at least nine standing committee members. At this time there are currently six active members.

I am not studying crime, or criminal behavior as it pertains to adult corrections. As a paid staff person for CASA FJD I train, support and supervise volunteers and staff in our program. We all provide our Family court judge with carefully researched background details about the foster child we are assigned to help the court make a sound decision about that child's future. Each home placement case is as unique as the child involved. The CASA volunteer must determine if the best interest of the child is staying with his or her parents or guardians, being placed in foster care, or being prepared for permanent adoption. The CASA volunteer makes a recommendation on placement to the judge and follows through on the case until it is permanently resolved. As the current Volunteer Supervisor and coordinator I work closely with child welfare agencies, GAL children's legal teams, the judicial system and courtroom staff as well as community agencies we partner with to make sure the children in our First Judicial District are safe, well cared for and find a permanent safe place to call home in a timely fashion.

DEC. 2013 COURT APPOINTED SPECIAL ADVOCATE (CASA), LEXINGTON, KY

2015 As a CASA I am appointed by a judge to I represent the best interests of children involved in the Fayette County Family Court system because they have been removed from their homes due to dependency, abuse or neglect. Through home visits and investigation (utilizing a court order), I collect, synthesize and report to the judge on information concerning the children that might otherwise be overlooked. I provide the court with carefully investigated details about the child to help the court make a sound decision about that child's future, whether it's a placement with parents or guardians, residential services, foster care, or permanent adoption. I spend the time required to become acquainted with the children and the people in their lives, following through on cases until they are permanently resolved.

- Provide advocacy services for the best interest of the child (in court and out of court).
- Act as the child's voice in court.
- Assess the needs of children and recommend to the court community resources and follow-up to make sure

Supervised staff and curriculum for this new facility designed to serve 200 children ages 18 months - 12 years.


