#### ISSUE

The Solid Waste Division of the Public Works Department was authorized in the FY19 budget to purchase a replacement for Unit 670, a "Roll Off" truck used to haul solid waste containers to the landfill. The vehicle has over 320,000 miles and is no longer suitable for its long haul service in the County.

#### BACKGROUND

The Buckman Direct Diversion's current year budget request included \$208,842 to purchase a similar vehicle to haul solids 5 miles to the landfill. The requested funding would have been split 50/50 between the City and County. Public Works staff suggested that Unit 670 would be satisfactory for this purpose and transferring the asset to the BDD would be a more efficient use of resources. BDD staff agreed and the budget request for the new truck was removed. The new roll off truck to replace unit 670 has been delivered to the body shop for outfitting and is scheduled to be delivered by the end of 2017.

Re: Vehicle Donation Acceptance

This letter is provided by the City of Santa Fe, as the fiscal agent of the BDD project, to accept the donation of a 2005 Sterling LT 9500, on behalf of the Buckman Direct Diversion Board.

The City of Santa Fe and Santa Fe County entered into a Joint Powers Agreement on March 7, 2005, governing the Buckman Direct Diversion Project. This agreement created the Buckman Direct Diversion Board and delegated the board in section 12 the authority to enter into a Project Management Fiscal Services Agreement, and designating in section 13 the City of Santa Fe as the Project Manager and Fiscal Agent of the Project.

During the FY 2017-2018 budget approval process, the BDD requested funding to purchase a new roll off truck to transport solids for disposal. This service is currently being outsourced and ownership of a vehicle would provide savings to the partners. Funding for this vehicle was reduced during the formal adoption of the 2017-2018 BDD Operating budget, as the public works department of Santa Fe County, had arranged to donate a comparable vehicle, providing additional savings in the funding of the vehicle.

The vehicle will be titled under the City of Santa Fe, as fiscal agent, however ownership will be the Buckman Direct Diversion Board. The BDD Board will provide insurance for the vehicle under its current policy with American Alternative Insurance. The asset will be inventoried and accounted for in the operations fund of the Buckman Direct Diversion.
