The recognition of Shelley Mann-Lev for her dedicated service as the Director of the Santa Fe Prevention Alliance, Prevention Coordinator Santa Fe Public Schools Office of Student Support Programs and her continued quest to champion initiatives to better the lives of Santa Fe County youth. Ms. Mann-Lev is retiring at the end of September, 2017.

BACKGROUND:

Shelley Mann-Lev is the founding Director of the Santa Fe Prevention Alliance and former member of the Santa Fe County DWI Planning Council. Mrs. Mann-Lev earned a Bachelor's Degree in Social Ecology from the University of California at Irvine followed by a Master's Degree in Public Health from the University of California at Los Angeles. Shelley's vast knowledge and experience in public health, policy and education as well as her community organizing and strategic planning skills have resulted in significant gains addressing youth alcohol and substance use.

Mrs. Mann-Lev's contributions include coordinating programs about alcohol, tobacco, drug prevention and other student safety issues for the Santa Fe Public School system; securing numerous grant applications to deal with underage drinking, opiate addiction and alcohol outlet density issues; and playing a significant role in the development of the 2016 DWI Program Strategic Plan. The above mentioned accomplishments are just a few of her most recent achievements in a career that spans over two decades.

Mrs. Mann-Levy's knowledge in public health, her commitment to the youth and compassion to make positive change has positively impacted the DWI program and the County. Mrs. Mann-Lev has served as the face of prevention in Santa Fe County for the past twenty years and her leadership skill will be missed.
