Enhanced 911 Grant Agreement Amendment

BACKGROUND

The New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration has submitted for approval two original copies of an amendment to the existing E-911 grant agreement to be presented to the Santa Fe County Commission for approval and signature.

The grant is a pass-through grant and does not require any matching funds from the County. This grant was effective July 1, 2014 and extends until June 30, 2015

The amendment reflects additional funding in the amount of \$717,430.00 that has been approved by the Board of Finance to replace 911 related telephone equipment for the Santa Fe Regional Emergency Communications Center. This increases the total amount of the grant from \$482,000.00 to \$1,199,430.00.

ACTION REQUESTED

Approval from the Board of County Commissioners is requested to authorize the Amendment to the Grant Agreement entered into by the Department of Finance and Administration, Local Government Division and Santa Fe County.

Request Approval of Grant Agreement between Department of Finance Administration, State of New Mexico, acting through the Local Government Division, and Santa Fe County for the Statewide E911 Program. Total Grant Amount of \$1,199.430 for provision and payment of Enhanced 911 services and equipment.

Grant No. 15-E-11

THIS AMENDMENT, hereinafter referred to as the "Amendment", is made and entered into by and between the Department of Finance and Administration, State of New Mexico, acting through the Local Government Division, Suite 202, Bataan Memorial Building, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 87501, hereinafter referred to as the "Division", and the County of Santa Fe, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee", as of the date this Amendment is executed by the Division.

WHEREAS, the Grantee and the Division entered into a grant agreement, effective July 1st, 2014 for an award of grant assistance to the Grantee in the amount of \$482,000.00 from the Enhanced 911 Fund ("Fund") for enhanced 911 services and equipment ("Grant Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Grantee has requested additional grant assistance from the Fund in the amount of \$717,430.00 for enhanced 911 services and equipment; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee and the Division desire to memorialize through this Amendment the terms and conditions upon which the additional funds will be made available to the Grantee.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and obligations contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby mutually agree to amend the Grant Agreement as follows:

- 1. Article III Consideration and Method of Payment, Section A of the Grant Agreement is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:
 - "A. In consideration of the Grantee's satisfactory completion of all work, purchase and maintenance of the equipment and services required to be performed in compliance with all the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement, the Division shall pay the Grantee a sum not to exceed the following amount from the Enhanced 911 fund: \$1,199,430.00.

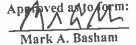
The funds are to be expended in accordance with the proposed Revenue/Expenditure Budget, attached as the "Exhibit C", and made a part hereof, and in accordance with 10.6.2.11 NMAC of the 911 Regulations, entitled PSAP Equipment, Acquisition, and Disbursement of Funds. It is understood and agreed that the Grantee's expenditure of these monies shall not deviate from the line items of said Budget without the prior written approval of the Division and the funds shall not be expended for ineligible costs, as described in 10.6.2.11.F NMAC of the 911 Regulations."

- 2. Exhibit "C" of the Grant Agreement is hereby replaced in its entirety with the "Exhibit C" attached hereto.
- 3. All other provisions of the Grant Agreement not amended herein remain in full force and effect.

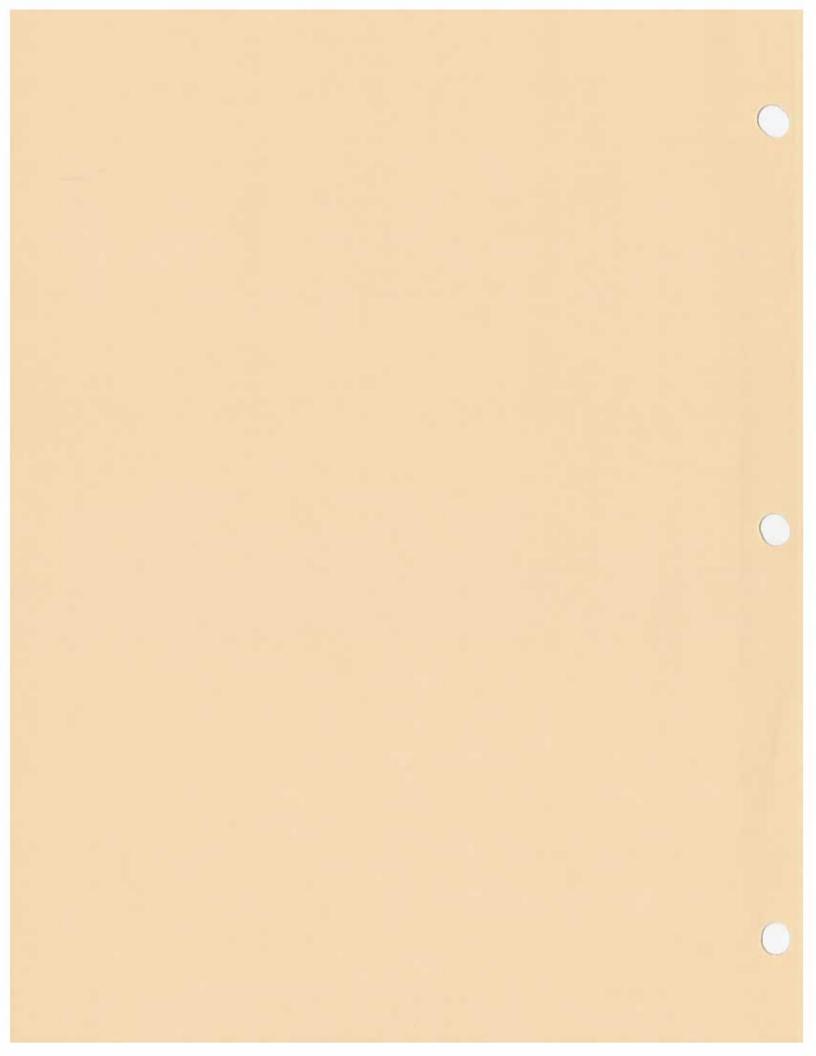

Presentation & Request of Direction on Proposed Shuttle Service to Santa Fe Ski

Area

Issue

North Central Regional Transit District (NCRTD) is collaborating with local stakeholders on a shuttle service to the Santa Fe Ski Area. The proposed service would be a public/private partnership and a one year pilot project for an 8-month service.

Background

The concept of a shuttle service to the SF Ski Area was originally introduced to the NCRTD in 2013 by the City of Santa Fe (Resolution 2013-93) and NCRTD staff has since been involved in assessing the economic and logistical viability of such a service. This project is referenced in the NCRTD Transit Service Plan. The outdoor economy is a target industry for both the County and the City and the shuttle service was also referenced in the County's Economic Development Plan of 2014 as something that would boost economic development via tourism and business recruitment.

Several stakeholder meetings have been held to elicit feedback from Ski Santa Fe, Tesuque Pueblo and others. Since the presentation at the January 13, 2015 BCC meeting where the issue was initially discussed, Ski Santa Fe and the Rio Metro Regional Transit District have each agreed to contribute \$15,000. A measure to reduce costs by \$25,172 by authorizing the use of an NCRTD owned 4 wheel drive vehicle will be brought before the NCRTD Board on April 10, 2014. The Santa Fe City Council authorized a contribution of \$25,172 to the proposed service. It is requested that Santa Fe County match the contribution in the amount of \$25, 172.

Evaluation Summary – Mountain Trail Route (South Capital to Ski Santa Fe/Santa Fe National Forest)

Benefits	 Transit Service will result in the elimination of single or multiperson vehicles on the roadway to the area. RTD experience indicates that as many as ~25-35 vehicles/day could be eliminated from usage of the roadway. Resulting in a reduction of peak day vehicle usage of up to approximately 5%. Elimination of vehicles from the roadway would provide for a reduction in hydrocarbons (~63 tons/year) and vehicle miles (~189,000 miles/annually), resulting in less wear and tear of the roadway and needed maintenance. Elimination of vehicles from the roadway would enhance safety for users of this roadway due to a decrease in vehicle traffic and the possibility of vehicle accidents, or encounters with wildlife and people. Use of transit can result in savings for those utilizing this service. There currently is no reliable information that the provision of transit will result in new or increased skier visits or that transit service will attract additional skiers from outside the area. However, over time the service might be viewed as an advantage for those visiting and skiing the area due to the convenience and safety it presents. Most riders are likely to be residents of the area who want to utilize public transportation. May contribute to SF County Gold-level designation by the International Mountain Biking Association by having shuttle service for downhill mountain biking.
