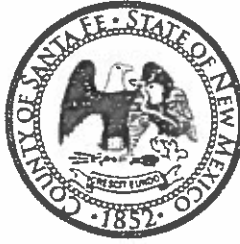

### **A PROCLAMATION HONORING NATIONAL CORRECTIONAL OFFICER, CORRECTIONAL NURSE, AND TEACHER APPRECIATION WEEK**

WHEREAS, correctional infrastructure, facilities, and services are vital to sustain communities and vital to the health, safety, and well-being of the people of Santa Fe County; and

WHEREAS, such facilities and services could not be provided without the dedication of correctional professionals, in both the government and the private sector. These individuals are responsible for the daily operation, safety, security, and humanity of the correctional facility in an honorable, ethical, safe, secure, and fiscally accountable manner, whether it be providing security, teaching, or lifesaving medical interventions; and

WHEREAS, it is important for citizens and civic leaders in Santa Fe County, the State of New Mexico, and elsewhere in the country, to gain knowledge of and have a progressive interest in the importance of correctional facilities and correctional programs; and

WHEREAS, both National Correctional Officer's Week and National Teacher Appreciation Week are celebrated the first full week of May, and the National Correctional Nurse's Week is celebrated May 6<sup>th</sup> to May 12<sup>th</sup>, and

WHEREAS, Santa Fe County calls upon Citizens and Civic Organizations across the County to acquaint themselves with issues involved in the public service of Correctional Professionals and Teachers; and to recognize the contributions that these professionals make to our daily health, safety, comfort, and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, these professionals are key members of the County's public safety team and play a vital role in our criminal justice system.
