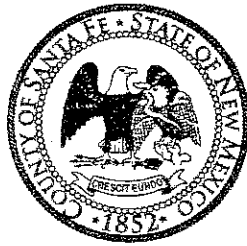

Re: Appointment of Two Members to the Health Policy and Planning Commission: One Member in District 2 and One Member in District 3 (Community Services Department/Patricia Boies)

ISSUE:

The appointment of two members to the Health Policy and Planning Commission (HPPC): one member in District 2 and one member in District 3.

BACKGROUND:

The resolution establishing membership on the HPPC provides for 13 members, two from each of the five districts, one appointed by the Mayor of the City of Santa Fe, and two Countywide appointments. Current vacancies include one in District 2 and one in District 3. These HPPC vacancies were advertised in the Santa Fe New Mexican and the Albuquerque Journal, a press release went out, the vacancies were posted on the County website, and outreach was done through email distribution. We received three applications.

RECOMMENDATION:

Based upon the applications received, staff is recommending the appointment of Barry Cooney to the District 2 position, and the appointment of Nelsy Dominguez to the District 3 position. Letters and resumes from both individuals are attached.


