ISSUE:

Approval of County Health Care Assistance claims in the amount of \$40,011.72.

BACKGROUND:

The BCC has approved funding for the County Health Care Assistance Program, to fund community-based providers. The Health Care Assistance Program has processed claims this month in the amount of \$40,011.72, as indicated on the Amount Paid to Vendors document.

Note that over the past two years, the Community Services Department has begun using Health Care Assistance Program funds not only for office visit claims but also contracts to further the County Health Action Plan priorities, including the Mobile Crisis Response Team and the low birth weight prevention/healthy baby initiative. Believing this results in better services with more accountability, we are transitioning this year to more contracts rather than claims, which means fewer dollars going into claims and more into deliverables contracts to support our priorities. We are in the process of putting out a Request for Proposals for the Federally Qualified Health Centers that serve County residents, to enter into contracts providing services and screening and navigation.

RECOMMENDATION:

We recommend the approval of County Health Care Assistance claims in the amount of \$40,011.72.

Request Authorization of the Use of District 3 Capital Funds, Per Capital Outlay

Policy, Allocating \$15,000 for Playground Equipment in the Village of Madrid

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY

In July, 2012, the Board of County Commissioners approved a Capital Improvement Plan, which included an allocation of \$200,000 for fiscal years FY 2013 and FY 2014. These allocations were made for capital projects within each district and only Commission District 3 has these prior year funds remaining.

The Madrid Cultural Projects organization is in the process of developing a new community playground (Project) located adjacent to the Oscar Huber Ballfields. Funding would be provided to leverage private funds secured for the Project specifically for the acquisition and installation of playground equipment.

RECOMMENDATION

Utilizing the approved allocation balance for District 3, the Finance Division is recommending approval of funds for the playground equipment in the Village of Madrid.

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
