The purpose of this memo is to provide you information relative to the SFC Public Safety Department for the month of October 2018.

CORRECTIONS DEPARTMENT **Adult Detention Facility (ADF)**

- During the month of October the Santa Fe County Adult Detention Facility had 639 intakes and 693 releases.
- October Vacancy Rate for Detention Officers was 19%.
- Meeting conducted with volunteers to advise them Melissa Oberg would temporarily be assisting with volunteer services. They were also provided with information regarding safety and security within the facility. A total of seventeen volunteers were present.

Electronic Monitoring Program

- Providing services to 353 clients.
- There were 27 successful releases for October.
- Clients Financial Obligation Paying- 24%, Waived 11%, Unemployed 63%, Out of County 2%.

Youth Development Program (YDP)

- October 1st, APIC Solutions Inc., began work on installing new cameras in the Youth Development Program. This will consist of approximately 80 cameras, wiring, monitors, and setting up the system.





DISCUSSION

Operations and Maintenance

Charts 1 and 2 below show our monthly work order volume. A more detailed break-out can be seen in Table 1, attached.





Solid Waste: The County average diversion rate was 14.83% in 2017. The month of October diversion rate was 13.97%, bringing the year-to-date average to 12.88%. See chart below.

- SFPW staff attended the **Santa Fe Solid Waste Management Agency Board meeting** that was held on October 18, 2018. The following Board Members were in attendance for the meeting: Commissioner Anna Hamilton Chair, Councilor Renee Villarreal Vice Chair, Commissioner Anna Hansen, Commissioner Ed Moreno, Councilor Michael Harris and Councilor Joanne Vigil Coppler. Several items were presented to the board at the meeting. These items include the following:
 - The Board approved that the Executive Director enter into a Material Transfer Agreement between SFSWMA and Momentum Recycling, LLC. The agreement allows for Momentum's Broomfield, CO facility to take SWMA's glass for two years. Under the agreement SWMA pays for transportation and Momentum pays SWMA \$35/ton for the material. The net cost to SWMA for recycling glass in this manner after considering handling, transportation and administrative costs will be approximately \$65/ton. The material will be turned into new glass bottles and can have up to 25% contamination rate. Transporting material to GrowStone is not considered an economically viable alternative at this time.
 - As of September 30, 2018, 4,489 tons of flood debris material had been delivered to the landfill by local government, resulting in \$193,353 in tipping fees. Of that, 2,109 tons came from the City and the remainder from the County. As of the meeting, the SWMA had not submitted for state disaster assistance for the disposal of the debris material.
 - Residential Household Hazardous Waste and e-Waste Amnesty Day is November 10, 2018.
 - ➤ BuRRT will be closed to the public during floor rehabilitation for four days in November; the public can still use the recycling area. Once the date has been determined, SWMA will post notices on site, issue press releases, and let the County know.

During under Matters from the Public, Joe Eigner spoke urging SWMA to consider climate change in all of its decisions and to have the work that Dave Yanke is doing include an analysis of greenhouse gas emissions from SWMA operations.

Utilities Division:

- The Aamodt team is finalizing the review of the Phase 2 60% Design which includes transmission lines and water tanks from Pojoaque to Nambé and Bishop's Lodge. Comments are due on November 5. We continue to work with the Bureau of Reclamation, the Pueblos, the State and the City on the 611(g) agreement for the funding gap. A draft 611(g) agreement was discussed at a meeting of the group on October 25. 611(g) meetings are held every other week; the next 611(g) meeting will be held on November 8 in Albuquerque.
- Santa Fe County Utility Staff have reviewed the following documents related to development submittals: Avanti, The Pantry at Oshara, Vintage Trailer Supply, JJR Development Greenhouse, and Santa Fe Metro Center.
- SFCU met with New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) to coordinate Quill
 wastewater treatment plant legacy sludge processing and removal efforts. Biosolids
 Management Plan has been drafted and will be submitted for review in September and is
 still being reviewed by NMED.
- SFCU Staff attended the **Buckman Direct Diversion Board Meeting** that was held on October 4, 2018. The following Board Members were in attendance for the meeting: Councilor Peter Ives Chair, Commissioner Anna Hamilton, Councilor Michael Harris, Commissioner Anna Hansen (County Alternate), Denise Fort, and Tom Egelhoff (Non-Voting). Commissioner Roybal was excused. Several items were presented to the board at the meeting. These items include the following:
 - Report on October 2, 2018 Fiscal Services Audit Committee.
 - Request for approval of Amendment No. 3 to the contract with Alpha Southwest for the BDD Raw Water Pump Project Bid No. 16/38/B to increase the contract sum by \$27,718.71 for a total contract amount of \$1,075,718.24. The motion was made to approve and the item passed by unanimous [5-0] voice vote.
 - Monthly BDD Operations Update given.
 - > Presentation on Los Alamos National Laboratory Cleanup Efforts.
 - New Mexico Environment Department Chromium Project Update Los Alamos National Laboratory.
 - > Report from Interim Facilities Manager given.

During Matters from the Public, Joni Arends spoke to the Board to express concerns associated with the possible future contamination of ground and surface water.

The Board voted by unanimous vote to enter Executive Session. The BDD Board Meeting adjourned at approximately 6:00p.m.

Project Delivery Division:

Utility Projects:

- Vista Aurora Subdivision Sewer Line Upgrade Construction Plans are at 95% completion. Utility Easements from private property owners are required prior to the construction of this project. One remaining utility easement acquisition is pending. Plans have been reviewed by City of Santa Fe and County Staff. Once the final utility easement is in place then project will be submitted to Procurement for a construction IFB.
- Santa Fe County Water Reclamation Facility—Design Build procurement is in process for this project.
- Village of Agua Fria Waste Water Projects Project staff has identified 8 projects and generated a scope of work for design services. The RFP for design services is in process. A pre-proposal meeting was held on October 17, 2018. Areas identified for this Project include Camino Maria Feliz, Dell Ross Lane, Rudolfo Rd, Terrazas Lane, Calle Hernandez, Ramon Lane, Pam Y Eutilia.
- Antonio Lane Sewer Upgrade Easement acquisition in process. Consultant has been directed to go to 60% design.
- Canoncito Regional Water Phase II Planning Phase: Project Manager has submitted RFP for Engineering design services and for Utility Easement Agreements to Procurement.
- Canoncito Eldorado Waterline Project Planning Phase: Project is in the negotiation phase of the procurement for engineering design services.

Road Projects:

- Camino San Jose The Design Engineer has submitted 30% design plans. County staff is in the process of reviewing the 30% design plans.
- CR54 Arroyo del Los Chamisos Construction began on January 17, 2018. Contractor will began working on construction of the erosion control structure along the arroyo November 9th, 2018. Project is estimated to be complete in December 2018.
- NE/SE Connector is in Phase D Design Oral Presentations for design services were held on September 26, 2018. Negotiations with the consultant for engineering design services are ongoing.
- CR55A General Goodwin Rd Design Upgrade. County staff has reviewed 100% plans and directed Consulting Engineer to make changes before acceptance of the plans. Coordinating with NMDOT for a maintenance easement along NM 14 and a drainage easement along the railroad right of way. In order for the project to drain properly, drainage improvements are required to be constructed within the NMDOT's right of way. The maintenance agreement and drainage easements are required by NMDOT for improvements within the NMDOT right of way.
- Torcido Loop Chip Seal and Drainage Improvements –County staff has accepted 100% plans. The project is in the procurement process for an IFB for construction services.
- CR89 and 89C Drainage and Roadway Improvements Projects are on hold until the surveys have been completed as per the settlement agreement with Pojoaque Pueblo. BCC approved the county manager authority to purchase easement's necessary for the construction project. County staff is working on easement acquisition.
- Santa Fe Racetrack Chip Seal and Drainage Improvements County staff has accepted 100% plans. The project is in the procurement process for an IFB for construction services.
- **CR67F La Barbaria** Construction began on October 15, 2018. Contractor is working on raising the road to the design subgrade elevation.

- CR 54 Arroyo Hondo All Weather Crossing- Engineering Consultant has completed the preliminary drainage report. Coordinating Temporary Work Permits with Pojoaque Pueblo.
- CR 72A All Weather Crossing County staff has accepted 100% plans. The project is in the procurement process for an IFB for construction services.

Building Projects:

- Fuel Catchment Basins Electrical connection to the Fuel Catchment Basins is required to complete the project. PM to submit procurement request for electrician.
- **Property Control Facility:** The project is scheduled to advertise for a General Contractor the weekend of November 11, 2018. Mandatory Pre-bid meeting is scheduled for November 29, 2018. Bid opening on December 20, 2018. Request approval by BCC on January 29, 2019 meeting.
- Hwy 14 Senior Community Center: Projects is in the process of requesting approval of a different delivery method.
- Turquoise Trail Fire Station in Cerrillos: The 30% set of construction drawings were reviewed by the Public Works Director on November 2, 2018. The Architect completed 60% drawings and reviewed with staff on November 5, 2018. On October 30, 2018 the Board of Commissioners approved an additional \$102,908.00 in funding for the project increasing the total project budget to \$1,307,135.00.
- Chimayo Fire Station Main: The design team completed the 30% construction drawings on October 10, 2018. The 30% set of construction drawings were reviewed by the Public Works Director on November 2, 2018. On October 30, 2018 the Board of Commissioners approved an additional \$3,518.00 in funding for the project increasing the total project budget to \$566,757.00.
- Eldorado Fire Station #1: The design of the apparatus addition was presented to the Eldorado Homeowners Association on October 23, 2018. The 30% set of construction drawings were reviewed by the Public Works Director on November 2, 2018. On October 30, 2018 the Board of Commissioners approved an additional \$105,716.00 in funding for the project increasing the total project budget to \$745,716.00.
- La Puebla Station #1: The design team completed 30% construction drawings on October 10, 2018. The 30% set of construction drawings were reviewed by the Public Works Director on November 2, 2018. On October 30, 2018 the Board of Commissioners approved an additional \$20,954.00 in funding for the project increasing the total project budget to \$1,616,951.00.
- Bennie J. Chavez Center Septic System Upgrade: The new grinder pump and leach field have been installed and the P. O. for the installation of the new septic tank has been received. The Notice to proceed and P. O. have been issued to Montano and Associates to begin the installation of the new septic tank.
- Edgewood Senior Center ADA Upgrades: CD's were completed November 5, 2018. Currently working on putting the project out to bid using the State Wide Price Agreement.
- Madrid Fire Station: The 100% construction documents have been completed and the project will be put out to bid the week of November 12, 2018.
- Turquoise Trail Fire Station No.2: A meeting with the Fire Dept. was held on Thursday August 16, 2018 for review and approval of the construction documents. Some changes to the plans were discussed and was incorporated into the plans. A follow up meeting with the Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief was held on October 22, 2018 to review the changes. After

- review of the changes the plans were approved. The project will be put out to bid the week of November 12, 2018 using the State Price Agreement.
- Tesuque Fire Station Retaining Wall: A meeting with the Fire Dept. was held on Thursday August 16, 2018 for review and approval of the construction documents. Some changes to the plans were discussed and a follow up meeting with the Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief was held on October 22, 2018 to review the changes. After review of the changes the plans were approved. The project will be put out to bid the week of November 12, 2018 using the State Price Agreement.
- Eldorado Fire Station No.2: A meeting with the Fire Dept. was held on Thursday August 16, 2018 for review and approval of the construction documents. Some changes to the plans were discussed and will be incorporated. A follow up meeting was held on October 22, 2018 to discuss the changes to the plans as well as providing a water source to the Fire Station. Currently the Fire Station does not have a water source and a follow up meeting with the Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief is pending regarding a water source to the Fire Station.
- Edgewood Fire Station No.3: A meeting with the Fire Dept. was held on Thursday August 16, 2018 for review and approval of the construction documents. Some changes to the plans were discussed and was incorporated into the plans. A follow up meeting with the Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief was held on October 22, 2018 to review the changes. After review of the changes the plans were approved. The project will be put out to bid the week of November 12, 2018 using the State Price Agreement.
- Abedon Lopez Community Center: The 100% CD's were delivered on November 5, 2018 and the project will put out to bid using the State Wide Price Agreement. PM met with SFC Land Use staff on October 31, 2018 to review the project and to list required document submittals for the SFC Planning Commission. The submitted documents will be reviewed by SFC Land Use staff and a hearing officer will then be assigned to the project. After approval from the hearing officer the project can then move forward and be presented to the SFC Planning Commission.
- Leo Gurule Basketball Court Demolition: We have been given the directive to pursue the demolition using in-house resources. Property Control and Open Space will be completing this task within the next 90 Days.
- La Cienega Community Center Parking Lot: Additional ADA information is necessary to complete the 100% construction drawings.
- Adult Detention Roof: Construction began on 10/15.
- Galisteo Fire Re-Stucco: A scope of work has been created for the re-stucco portion of the project; however, additional information needs to be added in order to fully meet the desires of the fire dept. The NMSPA will be utilized in the bid process.
- **District Attorney Office Renovation**: A meeting was conducted with the DA and pertaining staff to review existing drawings and budget discussions. There have been some desired modifications as a result of the discussions. Further clarification is necessary.
- **Public Safety expansion**: The mandatory pre-proposal meeting for the shortlisted Design-Build Teams is scheduled for 11/8/2018.

Open Space, Parks & Trails Projects:

• Santa Fe River - Frenchy's to Siler Construction: Staff received a Scope of Work from the engineers and negotiated a price with the contractor to conduct the repairs. All of the Change Orders and Contract Amendments were approved by the Board of County

- Commissioners November 13th. Anticipate repairs to begin on November 28th and will last for 2½ to 3 months.
- Santa Fe River Property Acquisition Section B: Tierra's Contract Amendment extending the term of their contract for 2 years has been executed. Tierra's schedule shows project completion in one year. Acquisition is complete on 11 parcels. Property owners have signed the purchase agreement and Tierra is working on title curation on 6 parcels. Closing on these parcels is pending until title issues resolved.
- BLM Parcels (Santa Fe River Trail): Archaeology survey report was submitted to BLM on 9/27/18 and the BLM staff is reviewing it. BLM Realty is preparing the notice requirements for noticing the disposition in the Federal Register, which is required under the program rules. BLM Realty plans to submit the notice by 12/1/18.
- Santa Fe River El Camino Real CLOMR: The CLOMR and 404 permit are in process.
- Arroyo Hondo Trail Design: Applications for TAP funding for construction of Segments 2 and 3 were presented and approved by the BCC on October 9, 2018. The designs for Segments 2 and 3 are currently at 60%, however the 60% design for Segment 3 terminates at a proposed future business park on Univest-Rancho Viejo property on the west side of Richard's Ave. Since the alignment study was completed in 2014, Univest-Rancho Viejo has not moved forward with a development plan and subdivision plat for the business park and does not anticipate doing so in the foreseeable future. The TAP funding requires that the trail provide a logical and publically accessible connection. In order to move forward with the TAP application, the design must be revised to extend the trail to Richard's Ave. The Project Manager has requested a proposal from the engineer to revise the plans for the TAP application.
- Arroyo Hondo Trail Segment 4: NMDOT signed the Cooperative Project Agreement on August 21, 2018. The agreement expires on September 30, 2020. The Project Manager submitted a PPR for a purchase order under the design contract for the construction phase engineering services for Segment 4.
- Mt. Chal: The Project Manager and INTERA met with the County Attorney on August 22, 2018 to review the Voluntary Remediation Work Plan and Agreement. The County Attorney is reviewing the documents. Once the County Attorney approves the VRP Work Plan and Agreement, the Project Manager will submit the documents to NMED for review and approval.
- Thornton Ranch Open Space: BLM held a planning workshop for the Burnt Corn Recreation Management Plan on September 19, 2018. The General Obligation Bond sale is scheduled for November 2018. The \$2,600,000 for implementation of the Master Plan will be budgeted in November 2018. The Project Manager is working to prepare the scopes of work for the preliminary environmental studies and design contracts.
- Santa Fe Rail Trail Segment 5: NMDOT signed the Cooperative Project Agreement on August 21, 2018. The agreement expires on September 30, 2020. The Project Manager sent a request for proposals to the engineering firms on the County's on-call contract for material testing and inspection services. Proposals have been received. The Project Manager sent a letter to NMDOT requesting concurrence to advertise the IFB for construction of the trail on October 4, 2018. NMDOT gave concurrence to advertise on October 4, 2018. The Project Manager is working with Purchasing to advertise the IFB.
- El Camino Real Retracement Trail FLAP project: FHWA is working to complete the close out process on the grant by January 2019. The County entered into an MOU with BLM for the development of the paved and crusher fine portions of the trail with the

- understanding that the County would submit an application for a permanent ROW after the trail was constructed. The Project Manager is preparing the application.
- Santa Fe Rail Trail Trailheads: Weston Solutions submitted 60% plan on May 10, 2018. The Project Manager is reviewing the plans with the Santa Fe County Building and Development Services and the Fire Department. Plan to construct the after Segment 5 of the Santa Fe Rail Trail is completed in the spring of 2019 so that the trailhead location can be used as the staging area for construction of Segment 5.
- Bennie J. Chavez Community Center Park: Santa Fe County issued a contract to MRWM for design services on August 15, 2018. The Project Manager issued notice to proceed on September 10, 2018. A kick off meeting was held September 12, 2018. The design team is working on the site analysis for the master plan.
- Pojoaque Valley Recreation Complex Phase III: The Landscape Architect submitted the programming report for review and approval on April 25, 2018. A public meeting was held May 31, 2018. The Project Manager and the Landscape Architect presented to TAC on July 5, 2018. The Landscape Architect submitted the Schematic Design on July 14, 2018. The Landscape Architect met with County staff to review the 50% Plans on August 22, 2018. The Landscape Architect submitted the 95% plans on September 19, 2018. The Landscape Architect submitted a draft of the Site Development Plan on October 3, 2018. The Project Manager plans to submit a request to Purchasing for an IFB for construction in October. The Project Manager anticipates awarding the construction contract at the January 8, 2019 BCC meeting and starting construction in January.
- Romero Park Phase II: On September 26, 2018, the Project Manager requested a proposal from the design consultant for the design and construction of a proposed water line to serve Romero Park. Staff has reviewed the estimate feels that the cost estimate from the consultant to be excessive and is contemplating other options to provide this service. The Project Manager sent a letter to SHPO requesting review and direction on how to proceed with the proposed cleanup of the regulated waste at the site on August 29, 2018. SHPO determined that LA 174455 is not eligible to the National Register of Historic Places and concurs that the remediation treatment plan proposed will not have an adverse effect on September 10, 2018. The Project Manager submitted a PPR to Purchasing for an IFB for the solid waste abatement and site leveling on September 13, 2018. The Project Manager anticipates advertising the IFB by the end of October.
