BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY:

On July 26, 2019 the Board adopted Resolution 2016-86, an Agriculture and Ranching Implementation Plan for Santa Fe County and directing staff to implement the Plan. Planning staff have been working on the implementation of the ARI plan to include the following:

- Demonstration of innovative agricultural demonstration projects on County owned property:
 - Los Potreros Open Space
 - Pojoaque Valley Recreation Complex
 - Edgewood Senior Center Demonstration Garden
- Coordinating development of AgriGate which is being designed as a web based platform for cultivating connections within our local food community:
 - Agricultural story map (searchable by food category to inleude local food producers, buyers and agricultural resource providers)
 - o Short film on farming and ranching in the Santa Fe region
 - o Links to partnering organizations and agricultural resources
 - An online discussion forum, a food community notice board, events/training calendar
