A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AVENIDA ELDORADO EXTENSION, COUNTY ROAD 44E EXTENSION (SILVERADO NORTHFORK) AND FIN DEL SENDERO FOR COUNTY MAINTENANCE

Whereas, Santa Fe County encompasses a geographical area of approximately 2,000 square miles; and

Whereas, the County is primarily rural with small areas of concentrated development; and

Whereas, a comprehensive road system is a necessary and vital link between communities; and

Whereas, there are an estimated 1,500 total miles of roads within the County; and

Whereas, of the total miles, approximately 580 miles are recognized as County Roads and maintained by the County; and

Whereas, the County's goal is to provide the best services possible to it's residents within the available resources; and

Whereas, the citizens of Santa Fe County continuously request the County to provide maintenance on Non-County roads; and

Whereas, the County has the authority and capability to accept roads for maintenance; and

Whereas, Avenida Eldorado extension, County Road 44E extension, and Fin Del Sendero are located within Santa Fe County; and

Whereas, the residents have asked the County to accept and provide maintenance on these roads; and

Whereas, the County has improved these roads with public funds to bring them up to County standards; and

Whereas, the County has conducted an inspection on these roads; and

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners believes it to be in the best interest of the residents to accept the roads; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Santa Fe County Board of County Commissioners accepts the following described roads for County maintenance.

Avenida Eldorado extension, an asphalt paved 24 feet driving surface road, from the railroad tracks to the intersection of Avenida Casa Del Oro, a distance of 1.65 miles.


County Road 44E extension, an asphalt paved 24 feet driving surface road, from the end of the existing County Road to the intersection of Cochiti Road, a distance of 0.25 miles.

Fin Del Sendero, an asphalt paved 24 feet driving surface road, from the intersection of Camino La Tierra to the beginning of lot 11, of the Mariposa Subdivision, a distance of 0.52 miles.

Santa Fe County does not accept any maintenance responsibility for residential driveways or drainage structures on driveways. It is advisable that residents repair damaged culverts and reinstall culverts to the proper flow line elevation. In the event that improper installation or lack of maintenance of drainage structures causes damage to the County maintained road, the County reserves the right to collect damages for repair against the responsible party.
