## A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A CAPITAL PLANNING PROCESS

**WHEREAS**, on June 5, 2019, the Board of County Commissioners ("Board") reviewed a capital planning process to facilitate clear, comprehensive, and transparent capital planning; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that improvements to the County's capital planning process will ensure better planning for and implementation of capital projects; and

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that more thorough planning and vetting of proposed capital improvements will benefit the residents of the County by providing adequate and functional capital facilities countywide.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board as follows:

- 1. The Board adopts the capital planning process outlined in Exhibit A.
- 2. The Board directs staff to implement this process and make adjustments, as necessary, to ensure the capital improvements planning process is as effective and efficient as possible.

# Santa Fe County Capital Planning Process

This document outlines the process for planning and implementing a capital project proposed by County staff, commissioners, or constituents.

- 1. County staff, commissioners, or constituents complete a project request form and submit the form on the capital planning database or to the Capital Planner.
  - Outreach to solicit staff and commissioner proposals in preparation for budget process (November)
  - Outreach to solicit constituent requests in preparation for CIP update process (May)
- 2. Capital Planner reviews request forms for completeness and works with persons requesting a project to refine proposal.
- 3. Capital Planner compiles and submits list of proposed projects to the Scoping Committee (December and June).
  - Scoping Committee consists of staff from the Projects Division, facilities maintenance and operations, user office/division (as appropriate), and the IT Department (as appropriate)
  - Scoping may also include Development Review, the County Attorney's Office, the County Manager's Office, the Finance Department
- 4. Scoping Committee examines user needs, relevant data, project costs, and fiscal impacts of proposed projects.
- 5. Capital Planner enters scoped projects into County's CIP.
- 6. Capital Planning Committee determines which proposed projects are basic services, evaluates proposals based on review criteria (January and July).
- 7. Capital Planning Committee sorts and ranks CIP projects using capital planning tool.
- 8. Capital Planning Committee reviews staff capacity to implement projects, creates capital project implementation schedule using capacity and scheduling tool (quarterly).
- 9. Capital Planning Committee and BCC update and adopt ranked and scheduled CIP (September and February).
- 10. Capital Planning Committee and BCC update and adopt ICIP based on high-priority projects in the Capital Budget (August).
- 11. Capital Planning Committee and BCC update and adopt annual Capital Budget based on five-year implementation window (May).

NOTE: Non-County entities seeking legislative funds administered by Santa Fe County will be subject to the process outlined in Resolution 2019 **123**.
