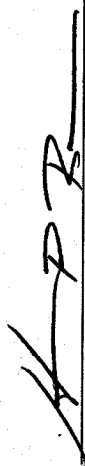

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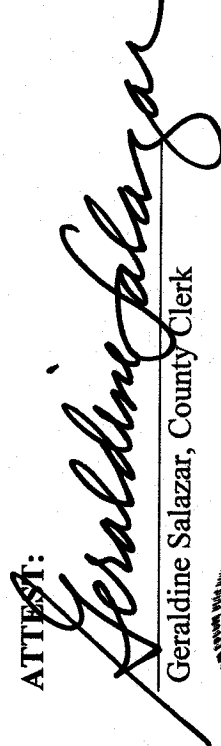

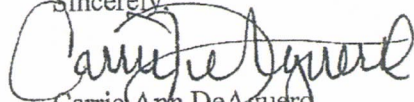

WASTE ISOLATION PILOT PROJECT
JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT



THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of this 6th day of MARCH, 2001, by and between the Public Regulation Commission (PRC)/State Fire Board, State of New Mexico, acting on behalf of the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO), and Santa Fe County, hereinafter called the County. Pursuant to the Joint Powers Agreement Act, Sections 11-1-1 et seq. NMSA 1978, the common power to be exercised as follows:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 59A-52-1 et seq. NMSA 1978, the SFMO has the power to coordinate with local public bodies to train firefighters.

WHEREAS, in the Cooperative Agreement between the State of New Mexico and the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), the SFMO in coordination with the New Mexico Radioactive Waste Consultation Task Force (74-4A-6 et seq. NMSA 1978), hereinafter called the Task Force, is provided funding to address emergency response preparedness as it pertains to the transport of hazardous materials under the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree that the method by which this purpose shall be accomplished is as follows:

ARTICLE I - SCOPE OF WORK

- A. The County agrees that it will implement, in all respects, the activities outlined in this project. The overall objective of this JPA is the enhancement of the County's response capability as it pertains to the transportation of hazardous materials, specifically WIPP shipments. The County shall:
1. Develop and implement a hazardous materials emergency response training program, including response protocols (suggested participants - firefighters, EMS providers, law enforcement officers, dispatchers, and other county workers as appropriate). The design of this program must be such that it will enhance the response capability of emergency responders as it pertains to hazardous materials without negatively impacting on other areas of response training. As a minimum, the program should focus on providing OSHA 29CFR 1910.120 compliant awareness level training for personnel that may come upon an incident while performing their normal duties; and operations level training for responders who will be likely to respond to an incident to take defensive actions to protect nearby persons, property, or the environment. Training must include instruction on the State Hazardous Materials Emergency Response (HMER) Plan

and emergency response as it applies to an incident involving a WIPP shipment.

2. Agree to develop and implement mutual or automatic aid agreements among adjacent fire districts and, if feasible, with municipal departments to facilitate timely, adequate response. The mutual aid agreements do not have to solely pertain to hazardous materials response.
3. Demonstrate proficiency as it pertains to hazardous materials emergency response through mutually agreed upon participation in drills and/or exercises conducted by the Task Force. Equitable payment of expenses associated with full-scale exercises will be negotiated between the County and the SFMO in coordination with and assistance from the Task Force prior to finalization of exercise planning. Such expenses are intended to be paid by the State through a member State agency of the Task Force, but be funded separately from this JPA.

B. The SFMO, in coordination with and assistance from the Task Force, will:

1. Provide funding up to the amount stated in Article VII to help offset expenses incurred by the County in the development and implementation of the program.
2. Render assistance in the development and implementation of the program.

ARTICLE II - LENGTH OF JPA

This Agreement shall not become effective until approved by the Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration. This Agreement shall remain in effect perpetually unless terminated pursuant to Articles III or IV below.

ARTICLE III - TERMINATION

This Agreement may be terminated by either of the parties hereto upon written notice delivered to the other party at least thirty (30) days prior to the intended date of termination. By such termination, neither party may nullify obligations already incurred for the performance or failure to perform prior to the date of termination.

ARTICLE IV - APPROPRIATIONS

The terms of this Agreement are contingent upon sufficient funding being provided by DOE to the State of New Mexico. If DOE does not provide sufficient funds, this Agreement shall terminate upon written notice being given by the SFMO to the County.

ARTICLE V - AMENDMENT

This Agreement shall not be altered, changed, or amended except by instrument in writing executed by the parties hereto and approved by the Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration.

ARTICLE VI - ALLOWABLE EXPENDITURES

- A. The County may use funds for training-related expenses, including course tuition, course materials, training aids, travel, per diem, and instructor salaries, that are incurred for the purpose of enhancing its hazardous materials emergency response capability as defined under Article I above.
- B. The County must have prior written approval from the SFMO WIPP program manager for any equipment purchases. Equipment purchase requests must be submitted in writing to the SFMO.

ARTICLE VII - METHOD OF PAYMENT

- A. Pursuant to the agreement between the State and DOE, the PRC/SFMO shall advance to the County funds in the amount of \$ 15,000.00 on an annual basis.
- B. It is understood and agreed that funds must be expended in the amounts and for the purposes designated in this JPA. Should any portion of the funds paid hereunder by the PRC/SFMO for the purpose designated remain unexpended after all conditions of this JPA have been satisfied, the unexpended funds shall revert to the SFMO/PRC for disposition.

ARTICLE VIII - CERTIFICATION

The County hereby assures and certifies that it will comply with State regulations, policies, guidelines and requirements with respect to the acceptance and use of the funds to be provided under this agreement. Also, the County gives assurances and certifies that:

- A. It has the legal authority to receive and expend the funds.
- B. It will finance any costs of the project(s) over the amount set forth in Article VII.A., including all project overruns.
- C. It will comply with the State Procurement Code (or local procurement code, where applicable) and will keep files of all related procurement documents, including but not limited to: requests for professional services, advertisements, minutes of pertinent meetings, selection and award criteria contracts, subcontracts and agreements.

- D. It shall not at any time convert any property acquired or developed pursuant to this Agreement to uses other than those specified in the scope of work as defined in Article I.
- E. At the termination of this Agreement, it shall own any property acquired as the result of the joint exercise of power.
- F. No member, officer, or employee of the County (or its designees or agents), no member of the governing body of the locality in which the program is situated, and no other public official of such locality or localities who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to the program during his/her tenure (or for one year thereafter), shall have any interest (direct or indirect) in any contract or subcontract (or the process thereof) for work to be performed in connection with the program assisted under the Agreement. The County shall incorporate, in all such contracts or subcontracts, a provision prohibiting such interest pursuant to this certification.

ARTICLE IX - QUARTERLY REPORTS

The County shall submit written quarterly reports summarizing accomplishments under this program for the previous three months. As a minimum, the reports will include number of responders trained, type or level of training, equipment purchased, and copies of finalized emergency response plans/protocols as identified under Article I. Reports will be due to the SFMO on or before September 30, December 31, March 31, and June 30 of each year.

ARTICLE X - STRICT ACCOUNTABILITY OF RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS

The County shall keep such records and will fully disclose the amount and disposition of the total funds from all sources budgeted for the project, the purpose for which such funds were used, and such other records as the SFMO shall prescribe. The County shall be strictly accountable for receipts and disbursements relating hereto and shall make all relevant financial records available to the Department of Finance and Administration and the SFMO upon request, and shall maintain all such records for a period of six (6) years following completion of all the conditions of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XI - COUNTY REPRESENTATIVE

WHEREAS, numerous shipments of hazardous materials pass through Santa Fe County each day; and,

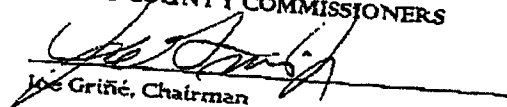
WHEREAS, the Waste Isolation Pilot Plant (WIPP) transportation route passes through Santa Fe County; and,
