# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A COMMUNITY PLANNING PROCESS FOR THE VILLAGE OF LA BAJADA TRADITIONAL COMMUNITY

**WHEREAS**, Santa Fe County (County) Board of County Commissioners (BCC) established a community planning process through sections 2.1.4 and 2.1.5 of the Sustainable Land Development Code (SLDC); and

WHEREAS, the community planning process is now fully incorporated into the County Sustainable Growth Management Plan (SGMP), adopted under Resolution No. 2015-155, and specifically described in Section 14.2.1.2 of the SGMP; and

WHEREAS, under the SGMP, a community planning committee initiates the planning process by requesting authorization from the BCC to proceed with a community plan, and that request must include a list of committee members and identification of a specific geographic area to be planned; and

WHEREAS, under the SGMP, the community planning process applies to "traditional historic communities"; and

WHEREAS, under NMSA 1978, Section 3-7-1.1 and the SGMP, "traditional historic communities" are defined as local communities that are documents to have been in existence for over 100 years; and

WHEREAS, the Village of La Bajada (La Bajada Traditional Community) has long been recognized as a traditional historic community, as memorialized in the SGMP; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the SGMP, the La Bajada Traditional Community submitted a Letter of Intent (Exhibit A) to establish a Planning Committee (La Bajada Planning Committee) and requested authorization to establish a community plan for the La Bajada Traditional Community and set forth therein the proposed members of the La Bajada Planning Committee; and

WHEREAS, Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference sets forth the preliminary boundaries of the La Bajada Traditional Community proposed by the signatories to the Letter of Intent; and

WHEREAS, there are multiple stakeholders and jurisdictions involved with the La Bajada Traditional Community including tribal governments, federal and state agencies, the

Registered Organization of La Bajada Community Ditch and Mutual Domestic Water Association, and the Community Organization for La Bajada Planning Committee; and

WHEREAS, the SGMP promotes intergovernmental cooperation and coordination to address regional issues and to support County goals; and

WHEREAS, staff has determined that the request submitted by the La Bajada Traditional Community complies with the requirements of the SGMP for initiating the community planning process.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Fe County that:

- 1. A community planning process is hereby authorized for the La Bajada Traditional Community area as identified in Exhibit B. The initial planning area will be refined through the community planning process.
- 2. The La Bajada Traditional Community Planning Committee, comprised of the members set forth on Exhibit A, is hereby authorized to begin a community planning process in coordination with the Santa Fe County Planning Division and in accordance with the SGMP.






SUBJECT: Letter of Intent forming the "La Bajada Community Planning Council"

Greetings Esteemed Planning Division Staff,

As discussed at the La Bajada Community Planning meeting you attended in our village on May 21, 2016, and approved at the General Assembly Meeting of the LBCD&MDWA on April 8, 2017; we are pleased to submit this letter of intent to you for presentation to the Santa Fe County Board of County Commissioners.

We seek the BCC's approval for your assistance in development of our Community Overlay Plan, to support our full inclusion in the Sustainable Land Development Code, as a Santa Fe County Traditional Community, according to the principles set forth in the Sustainable Growth Management Plan. We have determined by consensus the following objectives and purposes for developing a Community Plan within the SLDC:

- I. Restoration of County Road Maintenance for the Village of La Bajada (for which we have been taxed, but have not received services since circa 1981)
- II. Full participation in the Santa Fe County Agriculture Revitalization Initiative, and subsequent Agriculture and Ranching Implementation Plans
- III. Support for Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan funding, and Community Development Block Grant funding
- IV. Full participation in Santa Fe County's Transferrable Development Rights program
- V. Full establishment and recognition of agriculture and ranching for subsistence, income, and barter; cultivation and foraging of medicinal herbs; and provision of respite, transient lodging, and services for travelers and tourists, as traditional land uses in the Village of La Bajada for over three centuries
- VI. Designation of Equine livestock within our community as vehicles, not "pets", for the County Assessor's classification and valuation purposes
- VII. Continuous support from Santa Fe County Intergovernmental Coordination Office in civic intercourse with Pueblos holding lands within the boundaries of Santa Fe County
