RESOLUTION NO. 2023 – 007

A RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING THE POLLING PLACES OF EACH PRECINCT IN SANTA FE COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, AND CONSOLIDATING PRECINCTS, AMENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF VOTING PRECINCTS BY COMBINING 2 PRECINCTS AND CREATING 1 NEW AND SEPARATE VOTING PRECINCT, AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 1-3-1(B) AND (C) NMSA 1978

WHEREAS, Section 1-3-2, NMSA 1978 (2019) requires that, in June or July of each odd-numbered year, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) of Santa Fe County (County) by resolution must designate the polling place of each precinct in the County and (ii) consolidate any precincts pursuant to Section 1-3-4, NMSA 1978 (2023); and

WHEREAS, Section 1-3-5, NMSA 1978 (2019) requires that the Board, by resolution, i) create additional precincts to meet the requirements of Section 1-3-1, NMSA 1978 (1991) and ii) divide, abolish, combine or adjust the boundaries of any precincts as necessary to meet legal and constitutional requirements for redistricting; and

WHEREAS, Section 1-3-1(B), NMSA 1978 provides that "[a] precinct shall be divided or its boundaries adjusted if the precinct has had more than:

- (1) seven hundred fifty votes cast by voters of that precinct at a general election, based on the two most recent general elections; or
- (2) two thousand five hundred persons residing within the boundaries of the precinct, based on the most recent federal decennial census."; and

WHEREAS, Section 1-3-1(C), NMSA 1978 provides that "[a] precinct may be combined with another precinct or its boundaries adjusted if the precinct has had less than:

- (1) one hundred votes cast by voters of that precinct at a general election, based on the two most recent general elections; or
- (2) five hundred persons residing within the boundaries of the precinct, based on the most recent federal decennial census."; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by the Office of the County Clerk that Precincts 3 and 4 meets the criteria for combining precincts or adjusting boundaries set forth in Section 1-3-1(C), NMSA 1978 and Precinct 113 meets the criteria for dividing precincts or adjusting precinct boundaries set forth in Section 1-3-1(B), NMSA 1978, as described in Exhibit A and B, attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, creating new precincts to reduce or maintain a balanced number of voters in such precincts is both required by law and in the interest of the convenience of County voters; and

WHEREAS, combining Precincts 3 and 4 will not 1) violate the maximum votes cast or population requirements of Section 1-3-1(B); or cross any local, state or federal district boundary lines; and

WHEREAS, Exhibit A designates and describes the following the new precincts: Precincts 3 and 4 are combined to create a new Precinct 3; and

WHEREAS, Exhibit B designates and describes the following the new precincts: Precinct 113 is divided such that a new Precinct 4 is created out of the southeastern portion of Precinct 113; and

WHEREAS, the new precincts are composed of contiguous and compact areas having clearly definable boundaries that comply with the provisions of the Precinct Boundary Adjustment Act, as required by Section 1-3-1(A), NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, in order make voting more convenient and accessible to voters, the Board wishes to permit voters in the County to cast ballots in statewide elections at voter convenience centers through the use of consolidated precincts pursuant to Sections 1-3-2(B) and 1-3-4, NMSA 1978, NMSA 1978 as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that each polling place designated in this resolution complies with the provisions of Section 1-3-7, NMSA 1978 titled Polling Places; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that those precincts that are consolidated to create Voter Convenience Centers meet the requirements of Sections 1-3-4 and 1-3-7, NMSA 1978 will be available to voters of any precinct in the county to cast a vote at the Convenience Center, will make voting more convenient and accessible to voters of the consolidated precinct, will not result in delays for voters in the voting process, shall have a broadband internet connection and real-time access to the state-wide voter registration electronic management system, and are centrally located within the consolidated precinct; and

WHEREAS, for those consolidated precincts with more than one polling place, the Board finds that the interest of the convenience of the voters and providing accessibility to the polling place justifies the creation of additional polling places within the consolidated precinct; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that none of the consolidated precincts designated herein are composed of more than ten precincts; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that each polling place set forth herein provides individuals with physical mobility limitations an unobstructed access to at least one voting machine.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board as follows:

Section 1. Creation of New Precincts.

- A. As set forth in the attached Exhibits A, a new Precinct 3 is hereby created out of existing Precincts 3 and 4, and the boundaries of such existing precincts are hereby adjusted; and
- **B.** As set forth in the attached Exhibit B, new Precincts 113 and 4 are hereby created out of existing Precincts 113, and the boundaries of such existing precincts are hereby adjusted.
- Section 2. Consolidation of Precincts. Precincts in Santa Fe County shall be consolidated as set forth hereafter in Section 3 of this Resolution, Designation of Polling Locations. Any voter may vote in any consolidated precinct in Santa Fe County, regardless of precinct in which the voter resides.
- Section 3. Designation of Polling Locations. The location and designation of each polling place for each consolidated precinct is set forth as follows:
