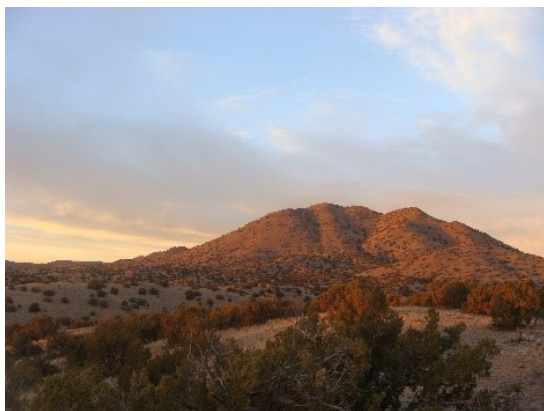


Summer is here and this a fun and exciting time to get out and enjoy all the fun events in our community. Here are a few things happening in District 3.

Cerrillos Hills is a year-round, day-use park located off The Turquoise Trail National Scenic Byway between Santa Fe and Albuquerque. You will cross paths with over 1,100 years of mining history along the five miles of trails and enjoy spectacular views of the Sandias, Ortiz, Jemez, and Sangre de Cristo mountain ranges. On July 9, 2019 at the Board of County Commissioner Meeting Commissioner Garcia brought forward a certificate of appreciation to recognize Black Bird Saloon, located in Cerrillos, New Mexico for their hard work and accomplishments in being named a Local Hero best restaurant, greater New Mexico in *edible* magazine.

An *edible* Local Hero is an exceptional individual, business or organization making a positive impact on New Mexico's food systems. These honorees nurture our communities through food, service, and socially and environmentally sustainable business practices.

This honor is nominated and voted by the readers for their favorite local chefs, growers, artisans, advocates, and other food professionals in two dozen categories.

Black Bird Saloon is located in Santa Fe County in a building that dates back to at least the 1880's and served as a mercantile in the early 1900's. Run and owned by Patrick and Kelly Torres, this Wild West charm with its interior accented by rustic wooden tables and chairs, tree branches, antlers, a long weathered standing bar, and an old piano is a local favorite hangout, and has become a tourist attraction to the mining town of Cerrillos.

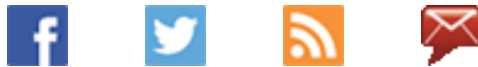
