Examples of Community Vision Statements:

Tesuque Village:

Tesuque Village seeks sustainable growth that protects our natural and historic resources, while preserving our values, qualities, and culture for the benefit of future generations. Tesuque seeks to retain its status as a traditional historic community by maintaining its character as a small village with roots in agriculture that go back to the ancestors of the Pueblo of Tesuque. The village is primarily residential, ethnically diverse, and with land use codes that accommodate both historic land use and single-family properties. We acknowledge that the village occupies the ancestral lands of the people of the Pueblo of Tesuque.

La Cienega/La Cieneguilla:

The villages of La Cienega and La Cieneguilla have unique histories, but we share a vision of peaceful and rural communities that respect diversity and are governed through unity. We will protect our natural environment, air and water resources, and unique character by honoring and preserving our traditional culture and the area's historical, agricultural, livestock, and rural low-density residential development traditions. We will maintain our self-sufficiency and protect our communities from impacts of urban developments. We will live in communities where people of all cultures and incomes share in decision making. We will live in communities where any changes, improvements, and decisions are informed by a realistic understanding of our available resources and our vision of a relaxed and open quality of life.

Village of La Bajada:

The Village of La Bajada will continue to be a vibrant and safe community which maintains the traditional Spanish settlement pattern with a central plazita, safe and secure community water and necessary infrastructure.

Galisteo:

In the future, Galisteo will be a place that continues to preserve its distinct character as a historically significant settlement in the Galisteo Basin while promoting a strong land, water and energy conservation ethic. The Village will continue to be a place where its history and shared values are honored and future generations can afford to stay and raise their families. The community will take steps to establish itself as a model of sustainability within the Galisteo Basin by implementing effective conservation measures of the land as well as the natural, cultural and historic resources and encourage community input and regional cooperation.
