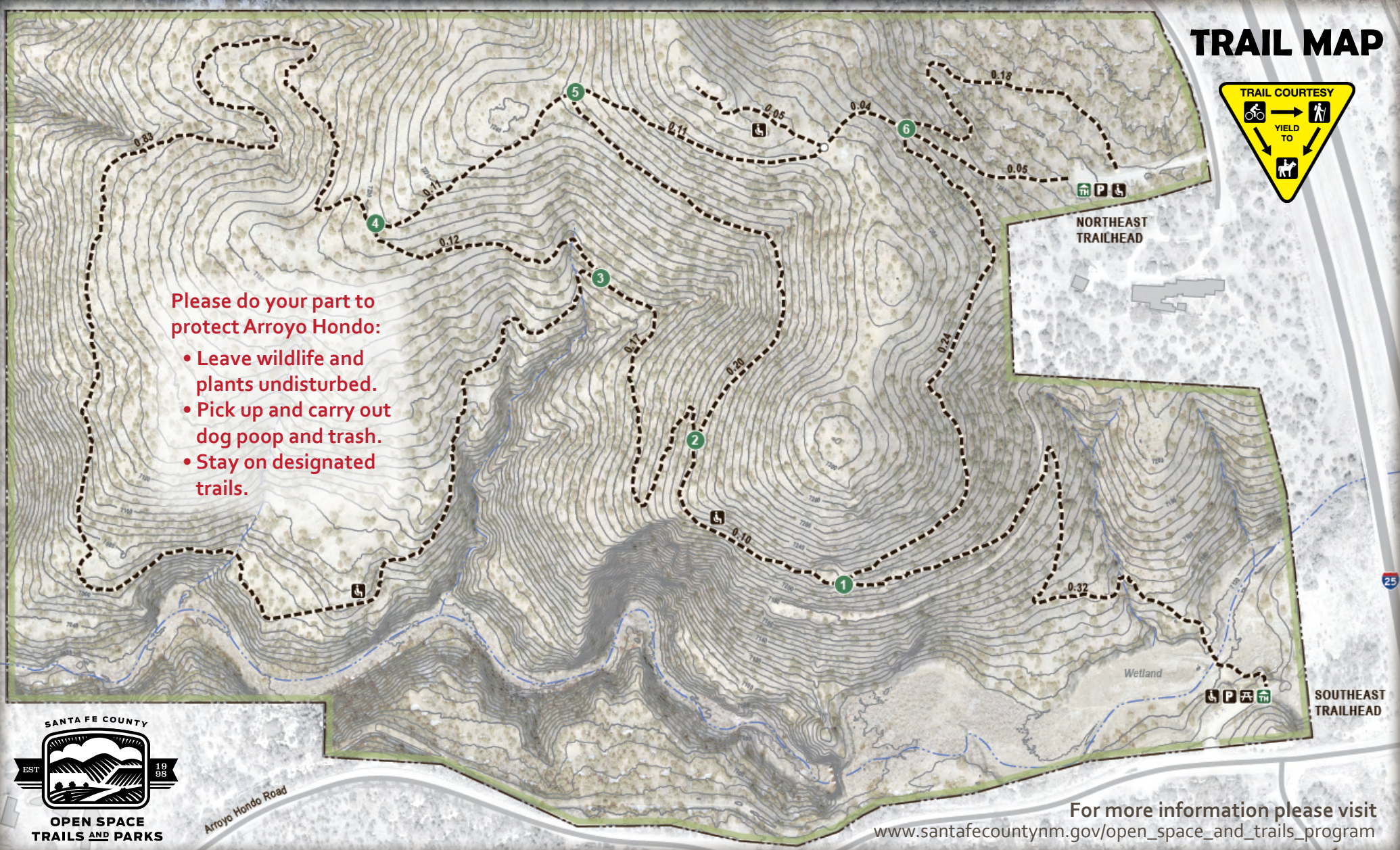
Nine species of cacti grow at Arroyo Hondo:
