ROSS PROGRAM

We are also pleased to continue offering resources and support through our **Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency (ROSS) Program**.

The Resident Opportunities and Self-Sufficiency (ROSS) program, funded by HUD, aims to help residents of public and Indian housing become more economically and housing independent. It achieves this by providing Service Coordinators who connect residents with resources and support services. These services can include things like education, job training, financial literacy, and healthcare.

Here's a more detailed breakdown:

- **Focus:** The ROSS program focuses on helping residents achieve self-sufficiency, meaning they can maintain stable finances, housing, and personal lives.
- **Supportive Services:** These services can include things like:
  - Education and job training programs.
  - Financial literacy and budgeting assistance.
  - Healthcare and childcare resources.
  - Elderly activities and aging-in-place support.
- **Partnerships:** ROSS coordinators also work to build partnerships with local organizations to ensure residents have access to a wide range of services.
- **Eligibility:** The program primarily serves residents of public and Indian housing.
- **Goals:** The ROSS program aims to help residents achieve economic and housing self-sufficiency, which includes increasing their income and building financial assets.

FSS PROGRAM

We are also pleased to continue offering resources and support through our **Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) Program**.

The **Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) program** is a HUD initiative designed to help families increase their earnings and build financial capability. It aims to promote economic independence among families receiving public housing assistance or Section 8 vouchers. The program includes:

- **Financial Incentives:** Participants earn a portion of their increased earnings in an escrow account, which can be used for savings or service payments.
- **Case Management:** Coordinators assist families in accessing services such as job training, education, and financial literacy.
- **Voluntary Participation:** Families can choose to participate, and the program is not mandatory.
- **Long-term Goals:** Participants work with coordinators to set and achieve long-term goals, such as job training and homeownership.

The FSS program is administered by public housing agencies (PHAs) and aims to reduce dependency on welfare assistance and rental subsidies.

## MAINTENANCE & WORK ORDERS: HELP US KEEP YOUR HOME IN TOP SHAPE!

To ensure your home remains safe and comfortable, we remind all residents to report any maintenance issues or needed repairs as soon as they are identified. Timely reporting helps us prevent small issues from becoming major problems.

**How to Request a Repair:** Please contact the Santa Fe County Housing Authority Administrative Office directly to place a work order. Our team will document your request and dispatch a technician as quickly as possible.

**Office Hours:** Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM  
Wednesday, 8:00AM to 12:00PM.

A four-digit work order number will be provided prior to call being complete.

### **Important Reminders:**

**Emergency Repairs:** For after-hours emergencies (such as major water leaks, gas smells, or a total loss of heat during winter), please call our emergency maintenance line at (505) 412-1613 and follow the prompts for the on-call technician.

**Provide Details:** When you call, please be as specific as possible about the location and nature of the problem so our Maintenance Technician can arrive prepared with the right tools.

## WINTER WEATHER PREPAREDNESS

- **Stay Informed:** Keep an eye on local weather forecasts and subscribe to emergency alerts to know when extreme weather is approaching.
- **Create an Emergency Kit:** Prepare a kit with essentials like a flashlight, extra batteries, a first-aid kit, a battery-powered radio, and a supply of non-perishable food and water.
- **Know Your Emergency Contacts:** Keep a list of emergency numbers handy, including local fire and police departments, utility companies, and the property management office.
- **Adjust Your Thermostat:** Set your thermostat to a comfortable temperature (around 68°F during the day) and lower it when you are asleep or away from home to save energy. Do not use ovens or stovetops for heat, as this can be a fire hazard.
- **Use Natural Heat:** Open blinds and curtains during the day to let sunlight warm your home, and close them at night to insulate against the cold.
- **Protect Pipes from Freezing:** Keep cabinet doors below sinks open to allow warmer air to circulate around plumbing. If temperatures drop very low, let a faucet drip slowly to prevent pipes from freezing.
