

What does this mean for you?

- Well owners must file Well Election Forms now
- Contact Scott Kaseman, at 505-992-9887, before April 2nd, if you wish to connect your home to the water system, and if you wish to have a service connection point installed on the pipeline that is currently under construction on CR84 and 84B
- Up to \$10,000 will be paid for by Santa Fe County for eligible service connections
- If you wait, you may not be able to connect to the system
- If you wait, you may miss out on funds to cover the cost to connect to the system



Santa Fe County wants to make sure all interested residents have a chance to connect to this system.



Pojoaque Basin Regional Water System

The water system will provide reliable, safe drinking water to Pueblo and non-Pueblo customers who are part of the Aamodt Settlement Agreement in the corridors of NM-502, NM-503, 285 from Pojoaque to Tesuque, and Bishop's Lodge Road.



Project timelines have moved up, and construction on service connections is starting in April 2026.





If you want to ensure your property has a reliable source of clean drinking water, please complete the attached **Acceptance / Well Election Form and file with the United States District Court** per the included Instructions.

The Bureau of Reclamation is constructing the waterline down County Roads 84 & 84B and residents along this corridor must decide now if they want to take advantage of having the connection fund pay to have their home connected to the water system.

The water system will be operational in a couple of years, but the connections are being added to these roads now.

Landowners with existing wells who file their Well Election Form before the construction is completed by their property are eligible for up to \$10,000 to fully connect their home to the system.

If you want to connect after the construction is completed by your property, you will be responsible for any costs to connect, if a waterline is available to serve the property.

The County is seeking landowner input about where to install the service connections to avoid obstacles and to provide a direct route to the house or well house.

Service connections will tap into the regional water system and provide clean drinking water to the household.
