Santa Fe County, NM — Clerk Katharine E. Clark and the Santa Fe County Clerk’s Office are proud to announce the conclusion of this year’s [*KidsVote: Practice Makes Future Voters*](#) program, which once again gave young residents a hands-on opportunity to learn how elections work.

This season’s KidsVote ballot featured fun, lighthearted questions designed to make voting approachable for children — from “Best Ice Cream” to “Best Type of Chile”. Kids also cast mock votes on community-themed “bond questions” and issues inspired by *The Wizard of Oz*.
