Santa Fe County Clerk's Office Reminds Voters to Use Official Sources for Registration; Opt-Out Available for Third-Party Mailers

Santa Fe County, NM — The Santa Fe County Clerk's Office is aware that some residents are receiving voter-registration mailers from nonprofit civic-engagement groups, including VPC and CVI. These mailers are not scams and are not issued by any government agency. They are sent by independent nonprofits that study voter-registration patterns and conduct outreach to people they believe may need to register or update a registration.

"We want residents to know exactly where to go for secure, official voter services," said Clerk Katharine E. Clark. "If you receive a third-party flyer, the best next step is to verify your voter record directly with the State at [NMVOTE.org](https://nmvote.org)."

What voters should do now

- Check or update your registration at the official State portal: [NMVOTE.org](https://nmvote.org).
- Prefer to stop future third-party mailings? Email unsubscribe@voterparticipation.org or unsubscribe@centerforvoterinformation.org with the unique code printed near the bottom of the letter, or call (757) 793-2671 (VPC) or (757) 664-9066 (CVI).
- For all local election information—including Permanent Absentee, locations, hours, and key dates—visit SantaFe.vote.

Voters may also see QR codes in the mailers that route to online registration. While these materials come from a nongovernment group, they also reference [NMVOTE.org](https://nmvote.org), which is the State's official voter portal.
