County Adult Facility Inmates Adopt a Family

When the Santa Fe County Corrections Department Program Coordinator, Renee Fernandez heard about a family in need during a difficult time, she got to work coordinating a volunteer effort to sponsor the family.

Fernandez got the inmates to team up and work to help a family facing a tough time. The family works hard, but last year when their 10 year old daughter Brianna was diagnosed with Cancer the travel for treatment between Santa Fe and Albuquerque took a financial toll on them, along with other medical and unexpected expenses.

According to Fernandez, she requested the necessary approval to ask the inmates to participate in helping the family during the difficult journey. The Programs Department met with each inmate and received positive feedback. The inmates that wanted to participate and were able to participate donated money from their individual inmate accounts. The inmates donations ranged from \$.10 to \$50. The inmates donated to the family almost \$330.

The check was presented at the Villa Therese Catholic Clinic (The Clinic that helped coordinate with the family). Below are some images from the exchange.

Imagination Library Comes to Santa Fe County

The Santa Fe Community Services Department announced they funded \$50,000 to partner with the United Way of Santa Fe County to bring the Dolly Parton Imagination Library to the children and families of Santa Fe County. The Imagination Library program was founded by Dolly Parton in 1995 to increase reading among young children. The program provides a carefully selected book that arrives in the mailbox, each month from the day the child is born until he/she is five years old. Books are selected by a national panel of experts.

“Less than half of the 13,000 students in Santa Fe school district read at grade level,” states Rachel O’Conner, Santa Fe County Community Services Department Director. “We are pleased to be partnering with United Way of Santa Fe County and Imagination Library to see if we can help increase reading scores amongst our young children.”

The United Way will serve as the “local champion” to assist the County in registering and enrolling children and publicizing the program. “We are looking forward to working in our community to enroll children across the County,” said Katherine Freeman, CEO of United Way of Santa Fe County. Freeman continued, “It is a natural fit with our early childhood and home visiting programs.” The United Way expects to enroll 525 children countywide in 2015.

According to a 2013 “Kid Count” profile, in Santa Fe County 46 percent of fourth grader students in Santa Fe County are proficient in reading. Research has shown that when families have more books at home, kindergartners arrive at school with higher early language scores.

Recycle Your Trees for Free

Starting on December 26, 2014, residents of the City of Santa Fe and Santa Fe County will be able to recycle their Christmas trees for FREE! This program, which is a joint effort by the City Environmental Services Division, the Parks Department, the Solid Waste Management Agency and several local businesses, allows the trees to be mulched rather than placed into our landfill.

Please **remove** the following items: lights (which can be recycled @ BuRRT), ornaments, and tree stands. NOTE: Trees with Artificial Snow (flocking) on them CANNOT be mulched, these trees should be disposed of as trash. Drunk drivers arrested for DWI after one previous drunk driving conviction will have their vehicle seized, then face forfeiture of that car, which could be sold at auction.

Santa Fe County Sheriff's Office has seized 105 vehicles this year and the Santa Fe Police Department has taken 333 from violators.
